


Wage Settlements

Covering 500 or More Employees

January 2008

Major collective bargaining settlements reached in January 2008 provided base-rate wage adjustments averaging 3.3% annually over the contract term, down from the 3.4% average in the previous month. The results are based on a review of 25 settlements and cover 51,500 employees.






the resulting wage adjustments averaged 2.7%, a lower gain than in their current round of settlements. Contract duration in January averaged 31.9 months, compared to the 40.6 months in the previous round of settlements.

The majority of employees (52.9%) covered by January 2008 settlements received wage increases ranging from 3.0 to 3.9%.

Wage adjustments in the public sector averaged 2.9% for 37,480 employees in 18 agreements; private-sector wage adjustments averaged 4.5% for 14,020 employees in 7 agreements. The lower public-sector figure was largely influenced by a single City of Montréal agreement, providing 10,000 municipal employees with a wage increase averaging 1.5%. There were 3 private-sector agreements with a relatively





high average this month: Construction Labour Relations-Alberta Association agreement, providing 5,330 employees with wage gains of 5.6%, and 2 General President's Maintenance Committee for Canada agreements in Alberta, providing 3,250 employees with wage increases averaging 4.7 and 4.8%.

On a jurisdiction basis, wage adjustments ranged from a high of 4.6% in New Brunswick (a single education-sector agreement with the Government of New Brunswick) to a low of 2.4% in Quebec. The second largest increase was recorded in British Columbia at 3.8%.

On an industry basis, wage adjustments ranged from a high of 5.6% in construction (due to a single agreement with the Construction Labour Relations-Alberta Association mentioned above) to a low of 1.8% in public administration (due largely to the City of Montréal agreement). The second largest

increase was in the primary industries sector at 4.8%. The largest concentration of employees (47%) was in the education, health, and social services sector and wage adjustments here averaged 3.4%.
