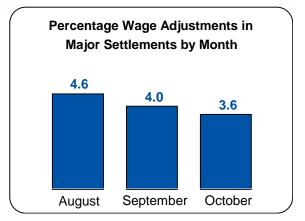

Wage Settlements Covering 500 or More Employees

October 2008

Major collective bargaining settlements in October 2008 provided base-rate wage adjustments averaging 3.6% annually over the contract term. The results for the month of October are based on a review of 26 settlements and cover 56,820 employees.



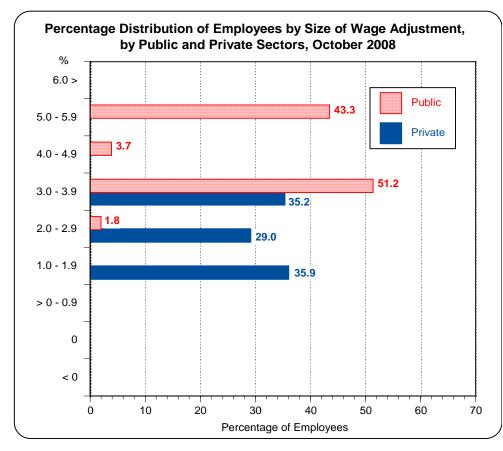
When the parties to these settlements previously

negotiated, the resulting wage adjustments averaged 2.8%, lower than in their current settlements. Contract duration in October 2008 averaged 40.0 months, compared to 38.4 months in the previous round of settlements.

Wage adjustments in the public sector averaged 3.9% for 46,780 employees in 19 agreements; private-sector wage adjustments averaged 2.1% for 10,040 employees in 7 agreements.

The higher average wage adjustment in the public sector was due in part to 3 health sector agreements in Alberta providing wage increases of 5.0% for 18,700 employees. There were also numerous education-sector agreements in Ontario with wage gains averaging 3.0%. The lower private sector average was influenced in part by agreements such as Westfair Foods (1.1%) and the Winnipeg Free Press(2.0%) in Manitoba and Garda Security (2.0%) in Quebec.





On a jurisdiction basis in October 2008, wage adjustments ranged from a low of 1.2% in Manitoba, to a high of 5.0% in Newfoundland, Quebec, and Alberta. The largest concentration of agreements (46.2%) and employees (43.6%) was in Ontario where wage adjustments averaged 3.0%; the second largest concentration of employees (35.1%) was in Alberta where wage adjustments averaged 5.0%.

On an industry basis in October 2008, wage adjustments ranged from a low of 2.0% in both the information and culture sector and the security services sub-sector (finance and professional services), to a high of 4.2% in the education, health, and social services sector. The largest concentration of agreements (65.4%) and employees (64.9%) was also in the education, health, and social services sector, including 8 Ontario education-sector

settlements at 3.0% and 3 Alberta health-sector settlements at 5.0%, mentioned above.

In October 2008, 48.3% of employees received wage adjustments in the 3.0 to 3.9% range; only 3.1% of employees received adjustments in the 4.0 to 4.9% range; 35.6% of employees received adjustments of 5.0%. Slightly less than 13% of employees received wage adjustments under 3.0%.

Wage adjustments in base rates for the first 10 months of 2008 (January through October) averaged 3.3%.

In the following tables, COLA is the abbreviation for Cost-of-Living Allowance.
