

Service bulletin Stocks of Frozen and Chilled **Meats**




January 2008

Highlights

• The January 2008 stocks of red meat in storage amount to 95 373 tonnes. This is up 8% from a year ago, and up 20% from October 2007. The stocks of poultry meat amount to 57 975 tonnes for January 2008, which is up 25% from last year, but down 12% from October 2007.

Methodology

This bulletin presents data on stocks of frozen and chilled meats at the wholesale level obtained from a quarterly census of known cold storage establishments registered with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. Included are such facilities as meat packers, wholesale butchers, abattoirs, and central warehouses of large retail grocery stores. Data not received in time for publication for the current period are estimated through imputation until such time as actual data are available. Therefore, current quarterly data are preliminary and subject to revision.
