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Preface

A co-operative is an enterprise that is jointly owned by the members who use its services. All members of a co-op are equal decision makers in the enterprise, using a democratic system of one-member, one-vote. In turn, all members share the benefits of co-operation, based on how much they use the co-operative's service.

Co-operatives serve both economic and social purposes. While a co-op exists to meet the common needs of its members, it also promotes the development of those members through their involvement in the democratic governance of the enterprise. At the same time, the co-operative is usually undertaking local social development or economic development activities, such as creating jobs or providing goods and services that would otherwise be unavailable to the community.

Co-ops take different forms and they operate in all sectors of the economy, but a co-op is generally set up by a group of people who share a common need. By pooling their resources and working together, the members can satisfy that need through the co-operative.

Canada's co-operatives play a vital role in the Canadian economy by providing essential goods and services to a significant portion of the population in areas such as retail, agriculture, manufacturing, housing and health care. This publication presents a statistical overview of the co-operative system in Canada to a wide and diverse audience.

Methodology

The statistics used in this publication are based on various sources:

- Reporting by non-financial co-operatives to the "Canadian Annual Survey of Co-operatives" undertaken by the Co-operatives Secretariat.
- Data on non-financial co-operatives collected by provincial/territorial governments and Industry Canada including information such as incorporations, dissolutions, name changes and amalgamations.
- Data on financial co-operatives is extracted from the Credit Union Central of Canada (CUCC) website and from Statistics Canada.
- Data is estimated in cases of non-reporting to the Canadian Annual Survey of Co-operatives where it is established that the co-operative is still actively operating.

Data is presented as follows:

- Data on non-financial co-operatives are presented by activity and by area of incorporation (provincial/territorial/federal).
- Data on credit unions and "*caisses populaires*" are presented by province.

Note: In the tables, itemized sums may not equal totals due to rounding.

CO-OPERATIVES IN CANADA

SITUATION - 2006

The 2006 statistics are based on survey results received from 5,687 non-financial co-operatives representing 6.4 million members, \$29.1 billion in total revenues and \$18.2 billion in assets. These co-operatives employed 87,871 people of which over 77.5% were full-time employees, including wholesale co-operatives and federations. Of these co-operatives, 898 were agricultural, representing over 339,000 active memberships and employing close to 33,300 individuals with total revenues of \$13.7 billion and assets of \$5.3 billion.

The number of non-financial co-operatives reporting to the survey was down 0.5% from 2005 and membership was up 7.8%. Volume of business and employees were up 5.9% and 0.7% respectively. The total assets was also up by 3.4%.

The number of agricultural co-operatives reporting increased slightly by 0.2% and active memberships were down 2.0%. Agricultural volume of business and assets increased by 1.6% and 0.7% respectively. The total number of employees of agricultural co-operatives was also higher by 1.6%.

PRODUCER CO-OPERATIVES

Co-operatives play a crucial role in the agricultural sector of the Canadian economy, particularly in farm supply and in the processing and marketing of grains and oilseed, dairy products, poultry, fruits, vegetables, livestock, as well as honey and maple products.

Agricultural marketing co-operatives are, for the most part, modern enterprises that use the latest technology to process and add value to farm products. A few large co-operatives account for the largest part of total revenues, including Agropur and Gay Lea Foods in dairy, La Coop fédérée in meat and poultry processing and Exceldor in poultry slaughtering and processing. The 157 marketing co-operatives reporting represent a major economic force with a combined business volume of more than \$8.7 billion and assets of \$3.2 billion. In 2006, they marketed over \$7.2 billion in agricultural products in Canada and abroad (see Table 4).

In **farm supply**, co-operatives play an indispensable role in the provision of farm inputs. They provide member co-operatives and producers with a broad range of farm inputs including fertilizers and chemicals, animal feed, seed, building materials and petroleum products. The 215 supply co-operatives reported total revenues of \$4.5 billion, down 6.1% from 2005.

Eight of the top ten agricultural co-operatives in Canada are marketing organizations and two supply co-operative rounds out the top 10 (see Appendix G).

There were 46 **fishery co-operatives** responding to the survey, 16% less than in 2005. They reported \$200.8 million in revenues, a 20.4% decrease from 2005. Assets decreased by 16.3% to \$79.9 million (see Tables 10 and 11).

Production co-operatives include **feeder, grazing, agricultural machinery, animal reproduction, forestry and handicraft** co-operatives. The 585 production co-operatives responding to the survey reported a combined volume of business of \$522.3 million. Those in Québec accounted for over 60% of the total volume of business. Québec revenues were derived primarily from the sale of forest products. Québec has the largest number of production co-operatives, with 204 organizations reporting. Management of feeder finance operations (132 enterprises) and grazing operations (132 enterprises) were the two main activities of production co-operatives, accounting for 45% of all production co-operatives (see Tables 12 and 13 and Appendix B).

CONSUMER CO-OPERATIVES

At the local level, **consumer co-operatives** vary in size and sophistication, from small buying clubs, to large supermarket organizations and wholesalers. At these "conventional stores", sales are made in the usual manner and any "surplus" is returned at year's end based on patronage (the purchases of each member at their co-operative). Revenues from the consumer group amounted to \$13.1 billion, with food products accounting for 35% of the total and petroleum products, dry goods and home hardware being the other main items sold (see Table 6).

The 283 member co-operatives of Federated Co-operatives Ltd. generated total revenues of \$5.4 billion, making this network the most profitable of all non-financial co-operatives. The 97 member co-operatives of Co-op Atlantic had revenues of \$467 million.

Calgary Co-op Association Ltd. is one of the largest retail co-operatives in North America. Their sales include food products, hardware, clothing, home furnishings, pharmaceuticals, petroleum products and building materials, as well as providing travel services.

Mountain Equipment Co-op (MEC), headquartered in Vancouver, British Columbia, specializes in the sale of equipment for outdoor activities. With 2.5 million members across Canada, it provides a catalogue sales service and operates eight stores outside British Columbia in Toronto, Burlington, Ottawa, Calgary, Winnipeg, Edmonton, Québec, Montréal and Halifax.

Although not as large or influential, Québec and Ontario consumer co-operatives are strong organizations, however, they have little penetration in large urban areas.

Student supply co-operatives have gained a strong foothold, especially in Québec, where 88 responded to the 2006 annual survey. These co-operatives reported a volume of business of nearly \$150.1 million with over 515,000 members. They provide the various goods students may require from stationery to textbooks. Several student supply co-operatives operate cafeterias and offer driver education courses (see Appendix A).

Service co-operatives make up the largest number of co-operatives in Canada and 4,161 responded to the survey, accounting for 73.2% of all non-financial co-operatives. In 2006 they reported a volume of business of \$2 billion, a 3.4% increase from 2005.

The largest single area of co-operative activity in the service sector is **housing**, where 2,169 co-operatives reported assets of \$5.2 billion and 112,693 members. In addition to housing co-operatives, which focus on providing housing to their members, there are other types of co-operatives that provide services related to housing and 81 reported to the survey. Most of them are co-operative housing resource groups involved with the development of emerging housing co-operatives.(see Appendix C).

There are two types of **child care co-operatives**: **daycare** and **nursery school**. Daycare co-operatives are formed by parents to provide daytime care for their children while they are at work. Nursery school co-operatives are formed with an emphasis on education and social interaction but also provide the parents with time for other pursuits. The greatest number of child care co-operatives are found in Ontario, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. There are 378 daycare and nursery school co-operatives reporting revenues of \$74 million and membership of 32,750 members.

Health care co-operatives play an important role in many communities across Canada. 105 health care co-operatives reported to the survey with 96,294 members and revenues of \$155 million. **Home care co-ops** are found mostly in Québec where many incorporations of this type have taken place in the past few years. A total of 51 reported from across Canada for the 2006 survey. Home care co-ops provide care mainly to the elderly.

Community development co-operatives foster local leadership skills and grassroots participation in innovation and solving social and economic problems. While these co-operatives are found throughout Canada, most are in Saskatchewan.

There were 299 development co-operatives reporting with 21,007 members, assets of \$52 million and revenues of \$53 million, an decrease of 5.4% from 2005.

Funeral co-operatives are located predominantly in Québec, although they have made some in-roads in the Maritimes, particularly in Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick. The 55 responding funeral co-operatives reported assets of \$142 million.

Water supply co-operatives are found mainly in Alberta, Manitoba and Québec. 168 responded to the survey.

Natural gas and rural electric co-operatives are found almost exclusively in Alberta where 80 of these co-operatives reported to the survey. Canada wide, 86 of these co-operatives reported memberships of 179,047 and assets of \$627.8 million and revenues of \$316.8 million.

Although **recreational co-operatives** are found in most provinces, they are most prevalent in Western Canada, particularly in Saskatchewan. The 268

recreational co-operatives reporting were engaged in various activities, including the management of community centres, skating and curling rinks, golf courses, campgrounds and swimming pools.

A number of **transportation and communication co-operatives** exist throughout Canada. Of the 61 transportation co-ops reporting, most were freight co-ops and taxi co-ops. They reported revenues of \$120.3 million and assets of \$66.2 million. In the past few years, car sharing co-operatives have been formed in large urban centres including Vancouver and Toronto, supplying their members with shared vehicles on a needs basis and saving members the high costs of owning an automobile (\$9,000 average per year), reducing congestion and in turn reducing pollution.

Most of the 98 communication co-ops reporting were of the radio TV/cable and editing and publishing types. They reported 96,988 members, revenues of \$131.6 million and assets of \$228 million (for other service co-operatives see Appendix C).

WORKERS' CO-OPERATIVES

Workers' co-operatives are employee owned enterprises and most of them are located in the province of Québec. Canada wide, 346 reported with a total of 13,209 members, revenues of \$469.9 million and assets of \$326.1 million. These co-operatives operate in a wide variety of fields, including **forestry co-operatives**, which accounted for 59% of the overall volume of business of workers' co-operatives in Canada, a total of \$278 million (see Appendix D).

These numbers include the worker/shareholder co-operatives in Québec. In this type of co-operative, employees can form a co-operative to buy blocks of shares in an existing business, thus enabling them to have a voice at the board of directors level. The increasing interest in workers' co-operatives reflects the determination of educated and informed people to have more control over their jobs and, consequently, their lives and communities. Worker co-operatives have also been identified as an option for business succession, particularly in rural and remote communities.

Another type of co-operative gaining in popularity in Québec is the **multi-stakeholder** or **solidarity co-operative**. Membership is made up of different categories of partners: service users, employees

and community organizations. In 2006, 73 multi-stakeholder co-operatives were incorporated in Québec. Many provide home care services to seniors and people with minor health problems.

FINANCIAL CO-OPERATIVES

CREDIT UNIONS AND CAISSES POPULAIRES

Credit unions and **caisses populaires** operate in all the provinces and reported assets of \$196.5 billion in 2006, an increase of 8.4 per cent from 2005. Québec accounts for 47 per cent of all credit union and caisses populaire assets (see appendices F and G).

CO-OPERATIVES AND INSURANCE MUTUALS

This category, which encompasses **sales of insurance by co-operative enterprises and mutual companies applying co-operative principles**, includes some of the largest companies within Canada's insurance sector. Five insurance co-operatives and two insurance mutuals have over \$33.5 billion in assets and provide services to policy holders that represent \$11.9 million certificates and policies¹.

Figure 1: Number and Membership of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 2: Volume of Business and Assets of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006





Figure 3: Volume of Business of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006

Figure 4: Product Marketings, Consumer and Supply Sales of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 5: Products Marketed as a Percentage of Total Marketings by Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006






Figure 6: Product Marketings of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006





Figure 9: Members' Equity as a Percentage of Total Assets of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 10: Five Year Moving Average, Number and Memberships of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 1998-2006*




Figure 11: Five Year Moving Average, Volume of Business of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 1998-2006*





Figure 12: Five Year Moving Average, Assets of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 1998-2006*

Figure 13: Volume of Business of Fishing Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 14: Number and Membership of Fishing Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 15: Service Revenues and Sales of Production Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 16: Number and Membership of Production Co-operatives, 2002-2006




Figure 18: Number and Membership of Service Co-operatives, 2002-2006





Figure 17: Volume of Business of Service Co-operatives, 2002-2006
