Clethodim

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1.0 Background

Clethodim was first registered in 1992 in Canada on a conditional basis and full registration was granted in 2006. It is a member of the cyclohexanedione family of herbicides and is used for post-emergent control of grasses in canola, flax (including low linolenic acid varieties), field peas, lentils, Desi and Kabuli chickpeas, dry onions, potatoes, yellow mustard, oriental (brown) mustard (condiment and oilseed types), soybeans, seedling alfalfa, sunflowers, dry common beans (*Phaseolus vulgaris* varieties only), spinach, coriander and, fenugreek.

Clethodim is applied as a spray by ground equipment only. Clethodim is applied at a maximum rate of 91.2 g a.i./ha on canola, flax, field peas, lentils, dry onions, potatoes, yellow mustard, oriental (brown) mustard, soybeans, seedling alfalfa, sunflowers, coriander and, fenugreek; and at a rate of 45.6 g a.i./ha on Desi and Kabuli chickpeas, spinach, and dry common beans.

2.0 Regulatory Update

The data that were submitted for the registration of the technical grade active ingredient of clethodim are considered to meet current data requirements. Scientific approaches used to assess this data and to establish relevant toxicity end-points are also considered to meet current standards.

Occupational exposure to clethodim is considered acceptable when wearing the personal protective equipment listed on the end-use product label (i.e. goggles or face shield, rubber apron, chemically resistant gloves, rubber boots, long sleeved shirt and long legged pants). Based on the current risk assessments, the acute toxicity and the low irritation potential of clethodim, the PMRA is requiring the minimum (default) 12 hour re-entry interval for all end-use products containing clethodim. There are no residential uses for clethodim, so this aspect does not need to be addressed. Exposure and risk to the environment are adequately mitigated by the current terrestrial buffer zones on the label which mitigates risk to non-target species through spray drift onto terrestrial habitats and aquatic habitats.

Since the original registration of clethodim, the federal government has developed the Toxic Substances Management Policy (TSMP). According to TSMP criteria, clethodim is not bioaccumulative or persistent and the n-octanol-water partition coefficient ($\log K_{ow}$) is 4.4, which is below the TSMP Track 1 cut-off criterion of ≥ 5.0 . Further, a fish bioconcentration study indicates much less bioaccumulation potential ($BCF = 3.5$) and a rapid rate of depuration. Clethodim does not meet all Track 1 criteria, and thus it is not a candidate for Track 1 classification as per the Federal Toxic Substances Management Policy and the Regulatory Directive DIR99-03.

Use of clethodim as a herbicide for post-emergent control of grasses in canola, flax, field peas, lentils, chickpeas, dry onions, potatoes, mustard, soybeans, seedling alfalfa, sunflowers, dry beans, spinach, coriander and fenugreek is considered to be associated with acceptable risk. Clethodim is acceptable for continued registration, provided end-use product labels are amended to include updated label statements (see Appendix I).

Appendix I Label Amendments for Products Containing Clethodim

Based on the Canadian use pattern of clethodim, Canadian commercial end-use product labels must be amended to include the following statements:

For commercial end-use products containing clethodim, the following must be included in the section of the label entitled “**PRECAUTIONS**”:

- **DO NOT** enter or allow worker entry into treated areas for 12 hours following application.

For commercial end-use products containing clethodim, the following must be included in the section of the label entitled “**DIRECTIONS FOR USE**”:

- Apply a maximum of one application per season on dry common beans (*Phaseolus vulgaris* varieties only).
