When it opens in 2010, the University of Calgary's new digital library will be the most technologically advanced student library in Canada, combining traditional resources such as printed books and periodicals with modern media, including digital video, e-books and touch-screen information kiosks.

Industry minister Tony Clement says "This certainly fits into my vision of Canada being the number 1 digital economy in the world. I believe that is part of how we are going to be productive and competitive and innovative in this society in the years and decades ahead."

Vancouver City Council is working on a plan that would place city information and statistics online in a form that people could access and use in their own computer programs.

"The city collects and records a phenomenal amount of data. If we want the city to run well, people need access to it," says Vancouver Councillor Andrea Reimer, who is working on an initiative that would radically alter the course of the city's information-technology department to promote what is called "open-source government."

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Headline: World's first treaty on access to information

Twelve European countries have signed the world's first treaty on access to information, which incorporates a minimum standard on the right of access to information.

In addition, the treaty establishes a right for anyone to request "official documents" - all information held by public authorities - at no charge and establishes optional provisions such as whether judicial and legislative bodies will be fully subject to the right to request and receive information.

Country – New Zealand

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Headline: Records Act audits to aid organizations

The Public Records Act audits of more than 2,000 organizations, to begin in 2010, are expected to focus not on past failures but on ways to improve.

Under the 2005 Act, fines of up to \$10,000 can be imposed for non-compliance, but Archives New Zealand acting chief executive and chief archivist Greg Goulding says the first round of audits will be looking at what organizations are doing well and where they could direct their efforts to be most productive.

A bill has been introduced in Congress that would authorize \$50 million annually for preservation activities to safeguard American historical records and make them more accessible to the public.

Key components of the Historical Record Act (H.R. 2256) include **(1)** the creation of a wide variety of access tools, including archival finding aids **(2)** preservation actions to protect historical records from harm, prolong their life, and preserve them for public use.

In July 2008, Maryland rules of law were broadened, requiring prosecutors to provide far more information to the defence before trial, including statements, photographs, documents and recordings.

As a result the Frederick County State Attorney's Office is using its electronic management system to review case documents by computer, allowing the prosecutor's office to provide e-discovery to the defence, a first in Maryland.

Global

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Survey Subject: Records Management Challenges

Survey Conducted by: ARMA International on behalf of CA, Inc.

Survey Participants: ARMA's entire membership base (over 9,000) with approximately 1,062 individuals responding with 75% of them holding [Records Management](#) jobs.

Key Findings:

(1) **72 percent** felt unprepared for email management.

(2) **68 percent** were unprepared for e-Discovery.

(3) **75 percent** did not have an enterprise system to manage content, digital or physical records.

(4) **62 percent** did not have an [email archiving system](#).

(5) **66 percent** use the same retention policies for physical and electronic documents, but many were not consistent in their application or enforcement of these policies.

(6) **41 percent** manage their email according to their retention policy.

The standard provides technical measures for guaranteeing the integrity of documents during the period of their conservation and takes into account rules relating to archiving (policies relating to archiving, security and the data protection).

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Title of Paper: Rethinking the Public Policy Process: A Public Engagement Framework

Author: Don Lenihan, Chair in Public Engagement, Public Policy Forum

Date: April 2009

Goal: To explain what public engagement is, how it differs from traditional consultation and deliberative processes, why governments need it, and how it works.

Summary: The paper is divided into three main parts.

Part 1 begins by introducing the idea of public involvement processes, then divides these processes into three basic categories: consultative, deliberative and engagement.

Part 2 introduces the concept of **deep structure** referring to how participants view the process as a whole, their role in it, and how it will reward or sanction their behaviour.

Part 3 draws on the discussion in Parts 1 and 2 to further describe the deep structure of engagement processes by providing a checklist of some of their defining characteristics.

While there has certainly been a reduction in paper consumption and CO2 emissions, there is still much work to be done in relation to document management, two issues being the absence of a culture of document management within companies and ignorance of good printing practices, which is still too prevalent. Examples of practices adopted by Japanese companies show that we still have a long way to go.

1. **Title of Report:** The Chief Archivist's Annual Report on the State of Government Recordkeeping 2008

Organization: Archives New Zealand

Date Published: May 2009

Overview: The report summarizes the state of government recordkeeping and makes recommendations for action by public offices, including departments, offices of parliament, Crown entities, and state enterprises.

Recommendations:

(1) All public offices must define basic policies and responsibilities for recordkeeping. Those organizations which have not begun this work must urgently address it.

(2) Public offices must ensure that the implementation of recordkeeping technology, such as an electronic document and records-management system, is supported by a comprehensive records-management program that includes policies, processes, guidelines, training, and communications. Without this framework such projects are unlikely to deliver value.

(3) Public offices must ensure that they have comprehensive disposal coverage under the Public Records Act 2005, including ongoing disposal schedules for their core business records.
