Employee engagement as a management concept is relatively recent (1990's) and describes the complete expression – physical, cognitive and emotional – of an employee in the performance of their work.

An engaged employee is someone who feels involved, committed, passionate, and empowered, and demonstrates those feelings in work behaviour
