#### Mental Health in the Workplace

Mental health is described by the World Health Organization as "... a state of well-being in which the individual realizes his or her own abilities, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to his or her community" (WHO 2001).

For many years, employee mental health was an issue seen as being separate from the organization. We are now aware of the effects an organization has upon the individual, as well as recognizing that healthy individuals, in turn, have a measurable impact upon the functioning and success of the organization.
