### 1. PRESENTATION:

*Symbols: 0.00 indicates an amount less than \$5,000. Brackets indicate negative amounts.*

This report continues a series, originally entitled "Annex to CIDA's Annual Report", which was published starting in 1967-68. As of 1993-94, CIDA's Annual Report is no longer prepared. However, this report continues to provide summary information on Official Development Assistance (ODA). It includes data for:

- { net ODA disbursements;
- { contributions of Federal Departments as well as Provincial Government contributions;
- { contributions to recipient countries;
- { contributions to non-governmental organizations and institutions.

The report also includes some information on countries in transition, which do not receive ODA (e.g. table M).

The tables show disbursements by type of assistance by:

- { geographic region;
- { administrative programs within CIDA;
- { sector.

### 2. ROUNDING:

The addition of the figures may differ slightly from the totals provided due to rounding. The numbers are calculated by computer, which carries figures to several decimal places.

### **3. OFFICIAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE (ODA):**

Grants or loans to countries and territories on Part I of the DAC List of Aid Recipients (developing countries) which are:

- { undertaken by the official sector;
- { with promotion of economic development and welfare as the main objective;
- { at concessional financial terms (if a loan, having a Grant Element of at least 25 percent).

Grants loans and credits for military purposes are excluded.

### **4. OFFICIAL AID:**

Flows which meet the conditions of eligibility for inclusion in Official Development Assistance, except that the recipients are on Part II of the DAC List of Aid Recipients (More Advanced Developing Countries and Central and Eastern Europe countries). References to Official Development Assistance in this report can be taken, *mutatis mutandis*, to apply to Official Aid.

### **5. NET ODA:**

Except as otherwise indicated, all disbursements of assistance are shown NET; i.e., minus capital repayments of earlier loans.

### **6. ALLOCABLE AND NON-ALLOCABLE:**

When it is possible to identify to which country a disbursement is made, the amount has been allocated to it. When the disbursement cannot be identified against any particular countries, as for Imputed Student Cost, the disbursement is then identified as Non-allocable.

### **7. ENCASHMENT VS CASH BASIS:**

ODA is currently calculated at the time when promissory notes to International Financial Institutions are deposited with the Bank of Canada - on a Commitment basis, and not calculated at the time of the encashment of the notes - Cash basis.

### **8. CONTRIBUTIONS TO INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS:**

In addition to the contributions made by CIDA, the Department of Foreign Affairs and Canada Post both make contributions to the regular budgets of certain international organizations. For some of these organizations only a percentage of each contribution is considered as a contribution to development. The percentage for each organization is provided to the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) by the organization itself.

### **9. IMPUTED (ESTIMATED) MULTILATERAL DISBURSEMENTS:**

Multilateral disbursements are made up of disbursements to: international organizations (including multilateral technical co-operation, World Food Program and multilateral Humanitarian Assistance) and International Financial Institutions (on a commitment basis). In an effort to estimate the portion of assistance going through those organizations to developing countries, the OECD has developed a series of coefficients based on the flow of resources (on a calendar year basis) transferred from these organizations to developing countries. This set of coefficients has been used in the estimated disbursement columns shown in table M. For those organizations with no coefficients, an



average of the coefficients available for the other institutions is applied. Then, these coefficients are applied to Canada's contributions to the international organizations, yielding estimated disbursements.

Please note that no estimates by country are needed for multilateral food aid since the actual value of food aid shipments, via the World Food Program, is available and used.

### **10. PROVINCIAL AND MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS:**

In addition to these contributions to NGOs, some provincial and municipal governments also contribute directly to developing countries. Municipal figures are not readily available and are not included in this report.

### **11. IDB LOAN REPAYMENTS:**

When Canada joined the Inter-American Development Bank on May 3, 1972, it agreed to return to the Bank the repayments (including interest) of the loans made to Latin America under the Canadian Trust Fund. These repayments are made directly from Latin American countries to the Bank and are not disbursed from the CIDA loan vote. However they are a Canadian contribution to the Bank's Special Fund and are added to Canadian ODA.

In 1997-98, Colombia reimbursed the totality of its outstanding loans, thereby showing a large increase in the amount of loans repaid to the IDB.

### **12. ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS:**

In 1979, DAC members, including Canada, agreed that Official Development Assistance (ODA) figures should include the administrative costs of extending assistance. This inclusion of

administrative cost data was intended to improve the comparability of total ODA figures among donor countries.

Our administrative costs include the expenses incurred by CIDA, IDRC, ICHRDD, as well as Foreign Affairs' representatives working on Official Development Assistance.

For all Countries in Transition, administrative costs in CIDA are allocated on a regional basis. In order for us to distinguish between administrative costs incurred in countries who are eligible for ODA and those who are not, we distribute these costs in the same proportion as the disbursements.

There was no attempt to separate administrative costs for Singapore (Foreign Affairs Field Staff) from the rest of ODA eligible countries because most of the administrative costs incurred there are associated with regional expenditure which is ODA-able. Please see table H for details on administrative costs.

### **13. COUNTRY FOCUS:**

In 1981, CIDA decided to reinforce its geographic orientation and strengthen the Agency's focus on the requirements of recipient countries. Country-to-Country mechanisms would be favoured but used in a coherent, coordinated fashion to attain the Agency's overall objectives in specific countries. This is also known as the "country focus" approach. Country focus projects administered by the geographic branches in 1997-98, 1998-99 and 1999-00 (amounting to \$218.7, \$189.6 and \$179.7 million respectively, are charged to Government-to-Government. As of 2000-01 there are no longer data for this activity.

#### **14. LOANS:**

Since 1986, no more loans are given to developing countries by CIDA.

#### **15. GRANT ELEMENT:**

The grant element is an index measure of a loan's degree of concessionality, or "softness", calculated on the basis of interest rate, grace period (interval to first repayment) and maturity (interval to final repayment). Specifically, the grant element is the difference between the face value of the loan and the discounted (at 10 per cent) present value of the service payments to be made by the borrower during the lifetime of the loan, expressed as a percentage of the face value. Thus, the grant element would be nil for a loan carrying an interest rate of 10 per cent; it would be 100 per cent for a grant; and it lies between these two limits for soft loans.

#### **16. GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT (GNP):**

GNP is the measure of total domestic and foreign output claimed by residents of a country. The assistance volume (net disbursements) of donor countries is expressed as a percentage of their GNP. In 2001-02 Canadian assistance represented 0.27 percent of its GNP. Data on GNP are revised periodically. Data are presented as received at the time of reporting.

By contrast to gross domestic product (GDP), GNP excludes goods produced and services rendered within its territory by non-residents.

#### **17. BILATERAL ASSISTANCE, including Country-to-Country and Government-to-Government:**

At the OECD: The OECD reckons that when countries maintain control over their contributions to such an extent that the decisions regarding disposal of the funds are taken at the discretion of the donor country, this assistance is considered bilateral. In other terms, the OECD considers all transactions that are not multilateral to be bilateral.

The equivalent term at CIDA is "Country-to-Country". This includes all Government-to-Government activities as well as disbursements through the Canadian Partnership Branch, bilateral food aid and bilateral humanitarian assistance. In addition, disbursements from ICHRDD and IDRC are considered as bilateral under the OECD definition. Country-to-Country disbursements are detailed in table M.

At CIDA: The term "bilateral" at CIDA is usually used to mean the "Geographic Programs", i.e. the Americas, Asia and Africa and Middle East programs. It is also known at CIDA as "Government-to-Government".

#### **18. MULTILATERAL ASSISTANCE:**

Contributions are recorded as multilateral if the recipient organization is active in development and if:

- a) amounts received are pooled so that they lose their identity and become an integral part of the organization's financial assets;
- b) members of organizations are government representatives acting in an official capacity and not as individuals.

Table M presents estimated disbursements that flow from the international organizations or

institutions (excluding WFP) to developing countries.

The Canadian Mine Action Fund was reported in Table F under (Humanitarian Assistance) last year, it is now reported in Table D (Multilateral Assistance Disbursements) under Canadian Land Mine Fund by Multilateral organization.

### **19. PROGRAM AGAINST HUNGER, MALNUTRITION AND DISEASE (PAHMD):**

CIDA's Program Against Hunger, Malnutrition and Disease responds to emergencies and fosters development. The overriding goal is to reduce hunger, malnutrition and disease as obstacles to sustainable development. Initiatives include, for example, food aid, micronutrient supplementation and food fortification programs to eliminate micronutrient deficiencies (vitamin A, iron and iodine). PAHMD breaks down its expenditures by: Emergency and Relief, Country to Country, NGO Responsive and Multilateral channels. This year represents a departure from previous years' reports in that, figures are shown to reflect disbursements according to PAHMD's programming.

### **20. INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE (IHA):**

At CIDA, the budget for International Humanitarian Assistance is managed by the Multilateral Branch. However, in this report, disbursements for International Humanitarian Assistance are detailed in three tables: D, F and M. Table D shows IHA disbursements of a multilateral nature. Table F shows IHA disbursements of a bilateral nature. Table M includes details from Table F allocated in the Country-to-Country section. The Multilateral

portion of the International Humanitarian Assistance is reported in the estimated multilateral section under "Others".

### **21. CAPITAL SUBSCRIPTIONS (INVESTMENTS):**

Capital subscriptions are also known in Canada as "investments". These subscriptions are assigned to each country when it becomes a member of an international institution. Shares are issued to members according to the amounts of their capital subscriptions. According to the articles of agreement, these shares are to be repurchased by the institution when a country ceases to be a member.

Capital subscriptions to international banks are committed in U.S. dollars and these amounts represent the actual payments in equivalent Canadian dollars.

Please note that these payments in Canadian dollars are different from the amounts appearing in the public accounts of Canada, in which the Government's financial assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currency are re-evaluated on a current valuation basis on March 31 each year.

### **22. CONTRIBUTIONS TO SPECIAL FUNDS (ADVANCES):**

Contributions to the special funds of financial institutions are known in Canada as "advances". These advances are similar to capital subscriptions, but no shares are issued to member countries. Contributions to special funds are returned only when a country ceases to be a member.

### **23. DEVELOPING COUNTRIES (LDCs):**

The Development Assistance Committee of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development uses the following list: all countries and territories in Africa; in America (except Bahamas, the U.S. and Canada); in Oceania (except Australia and New Zealand); and in Asia (except Brunei, Kuwait, Qatar, Singapore and the United Arab emirates). In Europe the list comprises Cyprus, Gibraltar, Malta, Turkey, Ex-Yugoslavia and the following states of the former USSR: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakstan, Kyrgyz Rep., Moldova (only since January 1997), Tajikistan, Turkemistan, Uzbekistan. For consistency with the DAC list, the developing countries from the states of the former USSR are listed under Asia in Table M.

### **24. LLDCs:**

An initial list of 25 LLDCs was defined by the United Nations in 1971 according to the following criteria:

- i) per capita gross domestic product (GDP) below U.S. \$100 per annum;
- ii) manufacturing under 10 per cent of GDP;
- iii) literate population (15 years and over) below 20 per cent of total.

Twenty-four countries have since been added to this list by the committee on Development Planning of the U.N. General Assembly for a total of 49 LLDCs.

### **25. NUMBER OF COUNTRIES:**

Canada is helping over 100 countries, but assistance is concentrated in about 30.

### **26. OFFICIAL SECTOR:**

CIDA is the official agency that has the mandate of co-ordinating development efforts in the world, but other federal departments and provincial governments also contribute to Canadian assistance. In this report we identify the major contributions of federal departments as well as provincial government contributions to non-governmental organizations. However, other smaller contributions from federal departments or from provincial or municipal governments are not included. When reporting to the Development Assistance Committee (DAC), flows from the Export Development Corporation (other than concessional export credits converted into ODA loans) are not reported as ODA but as Other Official Flows (OOF).

### **27. EDC SECTION 23:**

The Canadian government reports as ODA, concessional credits that it grants through the Export Development Corporation, under Section 23 of the EDC Act, when these credits meet approved development criteria (see note 15, above). These concessional credits are not, however, considered as part of the regular aid program budget.

### **28. IMPUTED FOREIGN STUDENTS COSTS:**

Imputed foreign student costs are the economic cost of educating ODA-sponsored foreign students in Canada. These costs are exclusive of tuition fees paid by foreign students or their sponsors.

**29. REFUGEE COSTS OF FIRST YEAR IN DONOR COUNTRY:**

Starting in 1993-94, Canada (as well as most donor countries) reports as ODA refugee costs during their first year in a donor country. These costs include expenditures to bring refugees in donor country and of costs for temporary sustenance (food, shelter and training) during their first year.

**30. INTERNATIONAL CENTRE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AND DEMOCRATIC DEVELOPMENT (ICHRDD):**

The disbursements for ICHRDD include disbursements during any fiscal year since 1993-94, even if they exceed CIDA's contribution of \$5 million. Starting in 2000-01, funds for ICHRDD will be paid by DFAIT.

**31. PUBLIC WORKS AND GOVERNMENT SERVICES CANADA (PWGSC) MANDATORY SERVICES:**

PWGSC provides services to other departments. An amount is reported each year, representing CIDA's contribution to financing of PWGSC mandatory services.

**32. DEBT FORGIVENESS:**

Debt Forgiveness has the same effect as giving a grant to a developing country in order to repay a loan. As such, it is also treated as a loan repayment. The effect on the transfer of ODA is nil.

**33. DEBT RE-ORGANIZATION:**

Official Bilateral Debt Relief refers to debt service relief (or forgiveness of debt) for developing

countries, negotiated through multilateral fora such as the Paris Club. Examples are the debt owed to the Canadian Wheat Board and the Export Development Corporation by developing countries.

**34. CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE:**

a) In 1995-96, the responsibility for program delivery to Central and Eastern Europe countries was transferred from DFAIT to CIDA. This program administers transfers to ODA-able and non-ODA-able countries. However, only those amounts spent in countries eligible for ODA are included in the ODA total.

b) The amount for "countries in transition" (ODA-able countries only) in "Table B" is higher in 1999-00 mainly due to the International Humanitarian Assistance to countries of the "Ex-Yugoslavia".

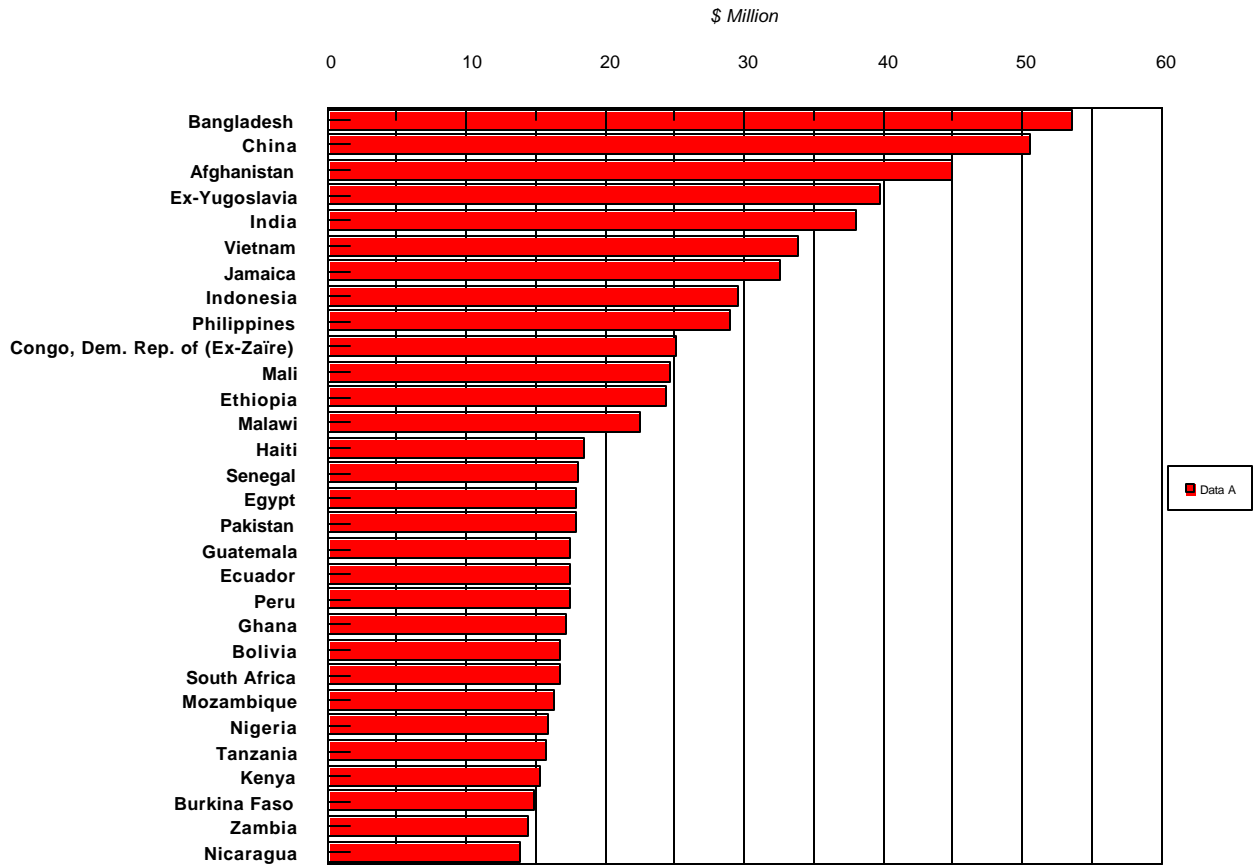
