Introduction

The Security and Defence Forum (SDF) can trace its origins to an initiative established by the federal government in 1967 to promote and strengthen Canadian academic expertise and interest in a wide range of security and defence issues. This academic grant programme, valued at \$2.5 million/year, is mandated to:

- Develop and support a strong Canadian academic competence in security and defence issues;
- Foster informed public discussion and commentary; and,
- Enhance communication between the Department, the Canadian Forces (CF) and the academic community.

The SDF carries out this mandate through three main activities:

- Annual grants to promote teaching, conduct research, and encourage publication in security and defence issues at twelve Centres of Expertise and a Chair of Defence Management Studies, located at universities across Canada;
- Awards such as scholarships and internships to individuals pursuing Master's, Doctoral and Postdoctoral studies on security and defence topics; and,
- Special Projects funding to support conferences or other unique activities, by individuals or organizations that are directly relevant to the mandate of the SDF.

This report, for fiscal year 2009/2010, covers the fourth fiscal year of a five-year funding cycle that will conclude in 2010/2011.

Governance

The Security and Defence Forum follows a programme accountability framework approved by the Treasury Board that includes indicators and reporting mechanisms to ensure that the Forum's activities have their intended effects.

An independent, ministerially-appointed Selection Committee meets to review Annual Reports from the twelve Centres of Expertise and the Chair of Defence Management Studies to assess their performance against Grant Agreements that were concluded at the beginning of the current five-year cycle.

The Selection Committee consists of representatives of academic, public and private institutions in the defence and security community. It ensures academic freedom, preserves neutrality in the review process, and contributes to the sound management of public funds.

The Committee also selects the recipients of various research and academic awards and internships.

On 17 June 2010, representatives from the twelve SDF Centres and the Chair of Defence Management Studies gathered in Ottawa for their annual Business Committee meeting.

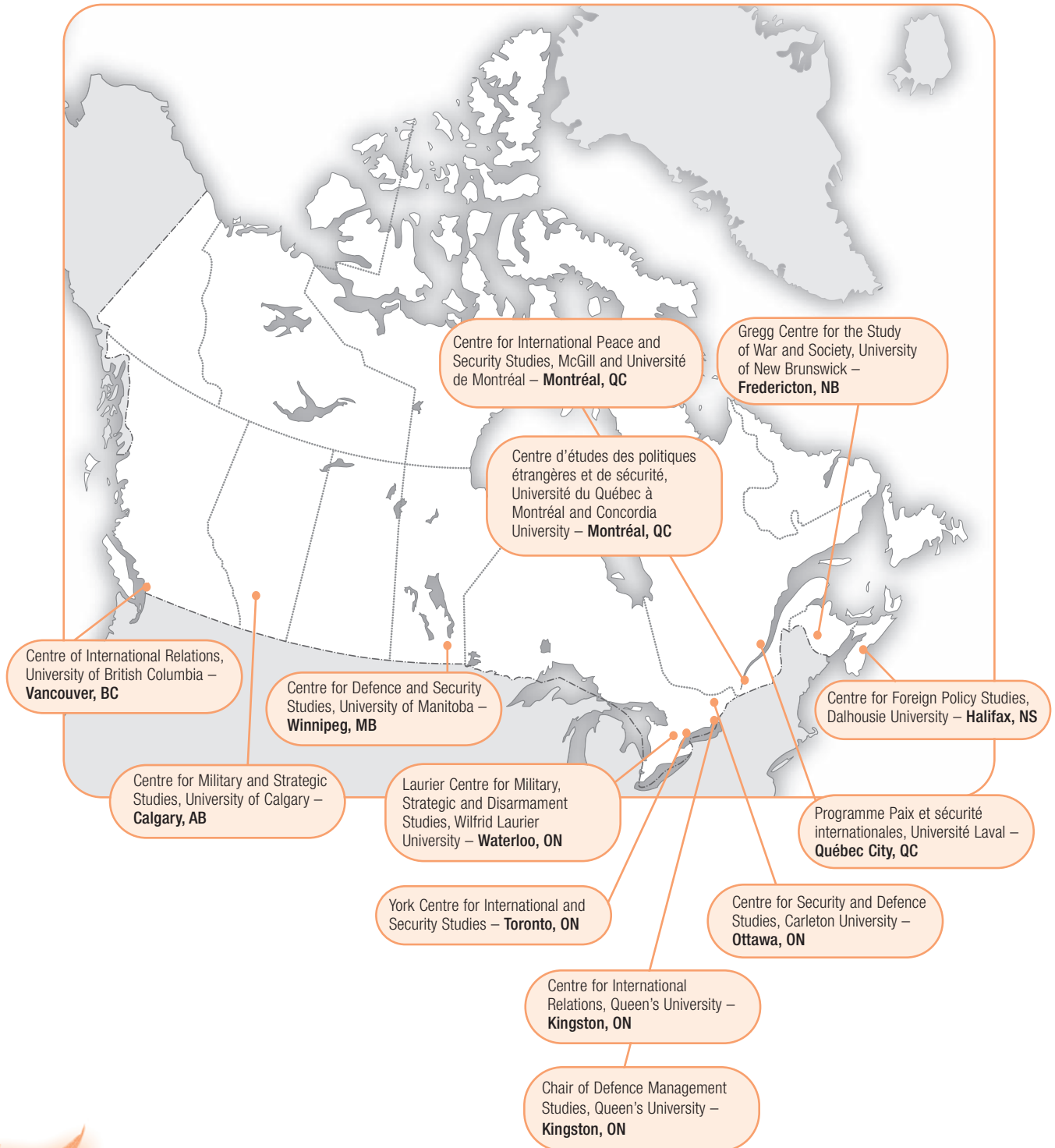

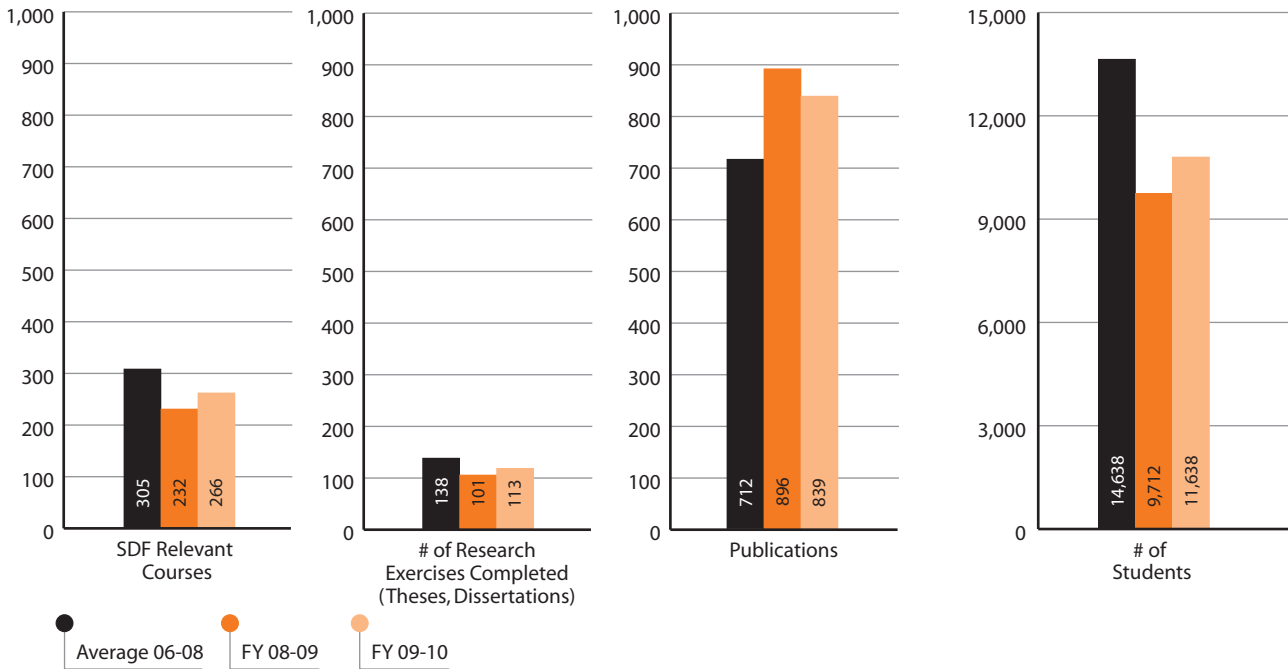

In FY 2009/2010, more than 800 faculty, staff, research associates and graduate students were involved in research, including 180 faculty members. SDF scholars produced 839 publications, and faculty taught 266 graduate and undergraduate courses. More than 11,600 students were enrolled in courses related to security and defence.

Academic Awards

Each year, the Security and Defence Forum supports the work of Canadian students in the field of security and defence by offering a number of scholarships and fellowships at the Master's, Doctoral and Postdoctoral level.

The SDF internship programme promotes the professional development of graduates, by encouraging post-graduate employment opportunities for defence research and analysis. Interns can work for a range of organizations in the security and defence field including think tanks, non-governmental organizations, and international organizations. In 2009/2010, the SDF provided funding to four Intern candidates, who worked at the Centre for International Governance Innovation, Rights and Democracy, the Conference of Defence Associations Institute, and the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute.

In 2009/2010, the Selection Committee awarded a total of \$382,500 in academic awards:

- one R.B. Byers Post-Doctoral Fellowship (\$35,000);
- one Post-Doctoral Fellowship (\$35,000);
- one Dr. Ronald Baker Doctoral Scholarship (\$22,500);
- three Doctoral Scholarships (\$20,000 each);
- nine Master's Scholarships (\$10,000 each); and,
- four internships (\$35,000 each).

Student Visits to National Defence Headquarters

Students from the Centre for International Peace and Security Studies (CIPSS) at Université de Montréal and McGill University, and the Centre d'études des politiques étrangères et de sécurité (CEPES) at Université du Québec à Montréal and Concordia University, visited National Defence Headquarters in Ottawa on 24 November 2009.

The students received a series of briefings by the Policy Group and Canadian Forces representatives on the *Canada First* Defence Strategy, continental defence, and the mission in Afghanistan. The students also had the opportunity to participate in a roundtable on the future security environment led by Mr. Philippe Hébert, Director Policy Development.



Special Projects 2009-2010

Available to the academic community, the voluntary and NGO sector, and private individuals, the Special Projects Fund provides support for a wide range of activities, including conferences, simulations, workshops and academic visits.

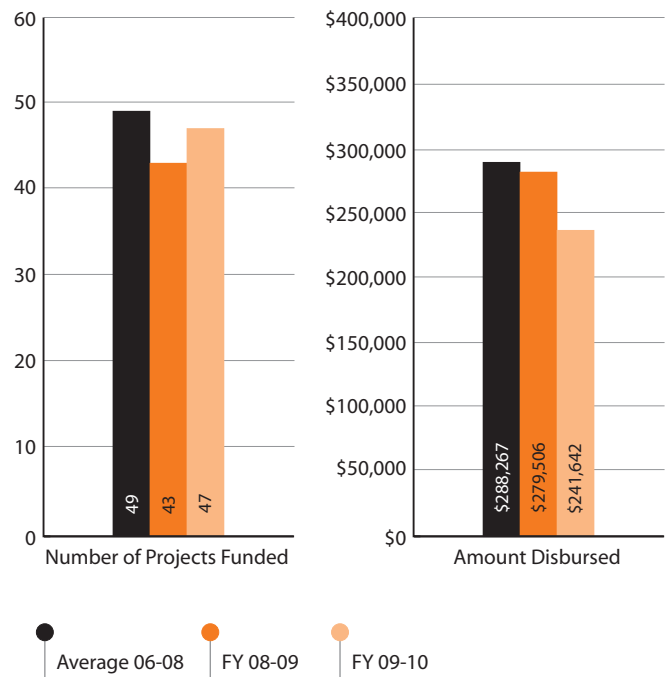
In addition to promoting a broad Canadian dialogue on security and defence issues, the Special Projects Fund helps to foster links between the public and the Department of National Defence and the Canadian Forces.

In 2009/2010, 53 requests for support were received, amounting to \$461,317. Of these, 47 activities were funded, totalling \$241,642.

Sixty percent of Special Projects funding went to SDF Centres and their affiliated researchers; the balance went to non-SDF universities, research centres, the voluntary sector and NGOs.

The Can-Am Sicily-Italy Staff Ride

The Gregg Centre for the Study of War and Society organized the Can-Am Sicily-Italy Staff Ride, a battlefield tour to Sicily and Southern Italy, from 14-24 May 2009. Open to SDF Centre Graduate Students and Faculty, the Can-Am Sicily-Italy Staff Ride brought together civilian graduate students with junior army officers from Canada and the United States.

Participating Canadian SDF Centres included the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies at University of Calgary, the Laurier Centre for Military, Strategic and Disarmament Studies at Wilfrid Laurier University, and the Centre for International Peace and Security Studies at Université de Montréal and McGill University. American partners included the US Army Command and Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and the US First Division Museum in Illinois.

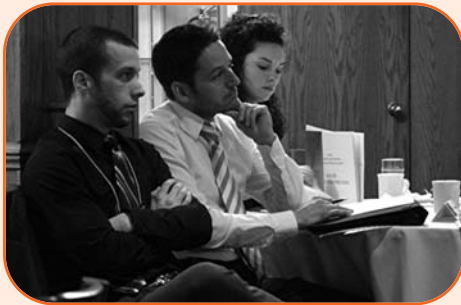

Sessions focused on the geopolitics of terrorism, as well as the impacts of terrorism on migration and international human rights law.

The Chair in Defence Management Studies at Queen's University, together with the Director of Security and Defence Management and Policy Program at The Royal Military College of Canada, organized a conference entitled "A Shipbuilding and Ship Procurement Strategy for Canada?" on 4 November 2009 in Kingston. The objectives of the conference were to discuss Canada's current shipbuilding and procurement strategies; compare and contrast them with similar programs in other nations; and provide a platform for stakeholders to discuss the development and implementation of a future strategy for Canada.

Conference: "The Future of Nuclear Strategy"

The Centre for Defence and Security Studies at the University of Manitoba, along with the Centre for Foreign Policy Studies at Dalhousie University and the Canadian International Council, hosted a conference entitled "The Future of Nuclear Strategy" on 24-25 September 2009 in Winnipeg. More than 25 academics, students and members of the public participated in the conference and were briefed by a range of experts, including Gen. (Ret.) Ray Hénault and Mr. Troy Lulashnyk from the Department of Foreign Affairs.

The conference was organized around four inter-related sub-themes:

- Nuclear strategy and the lessons of the Cold War;
- The future of nuclear strategy from the perspectives of the US, Russia, China, France, the United Kingdom, India, Iran, Israel, North Korea and Pakistan;
- The implications of nuclear strategy on proliferation incentives and arms control; and,
- The implications for Canada.

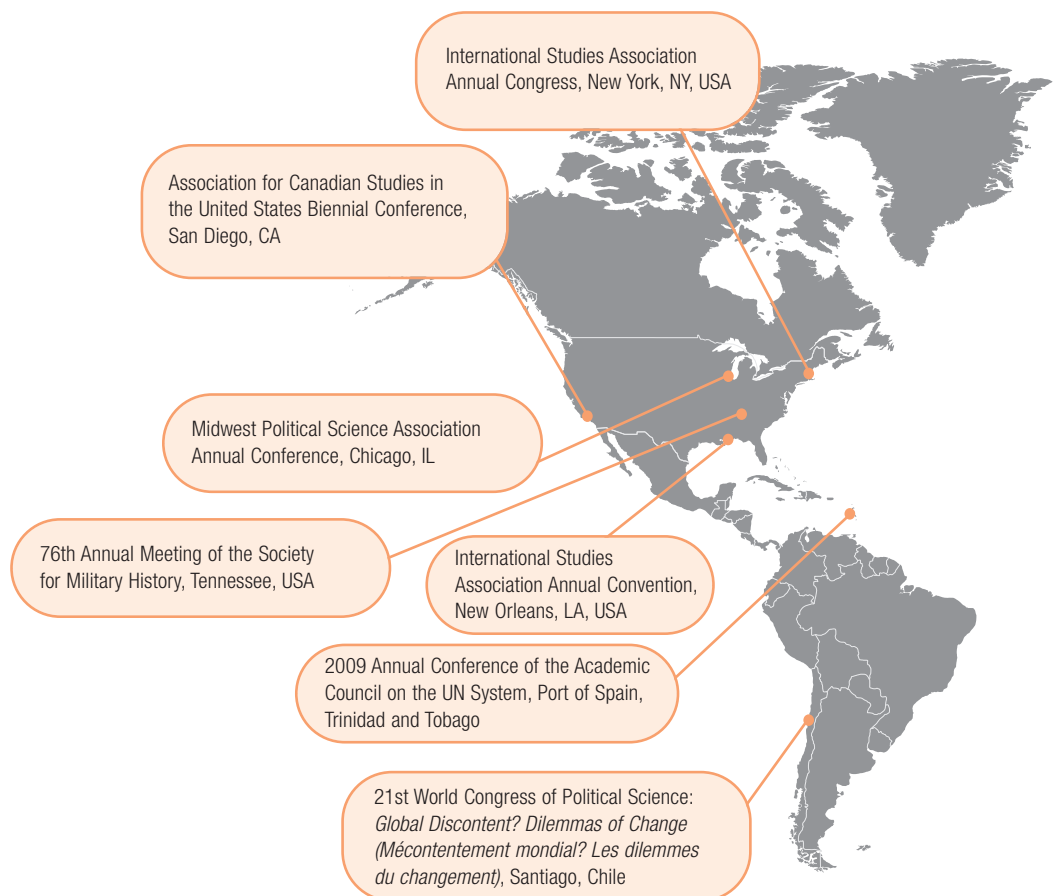

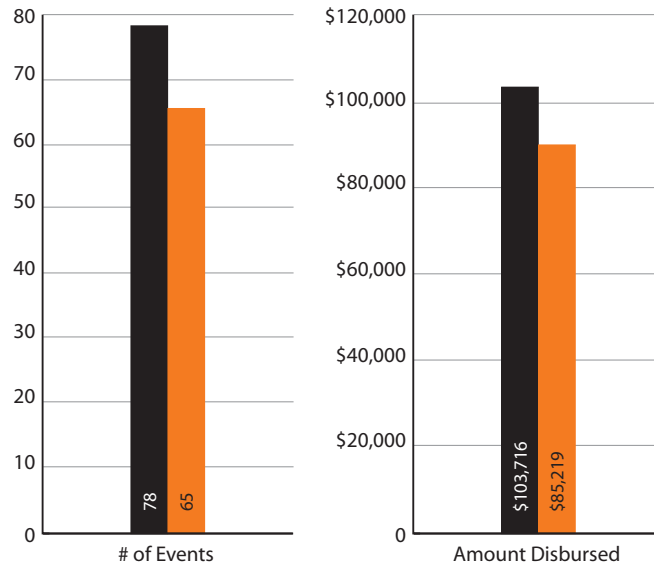
International Conference Fund

To help promote a Canadian voice and perspective at international conferences, each SDF Centre of Expertise may access the International Conference Fund to facilitate travel by junior faculty and graduate students.

In FY 09-10, the Fund was used 65 times, for a total of \$85,219, and resulted in Canadian scholars being heard in 13 different countries. Details are listed in Appendix D.

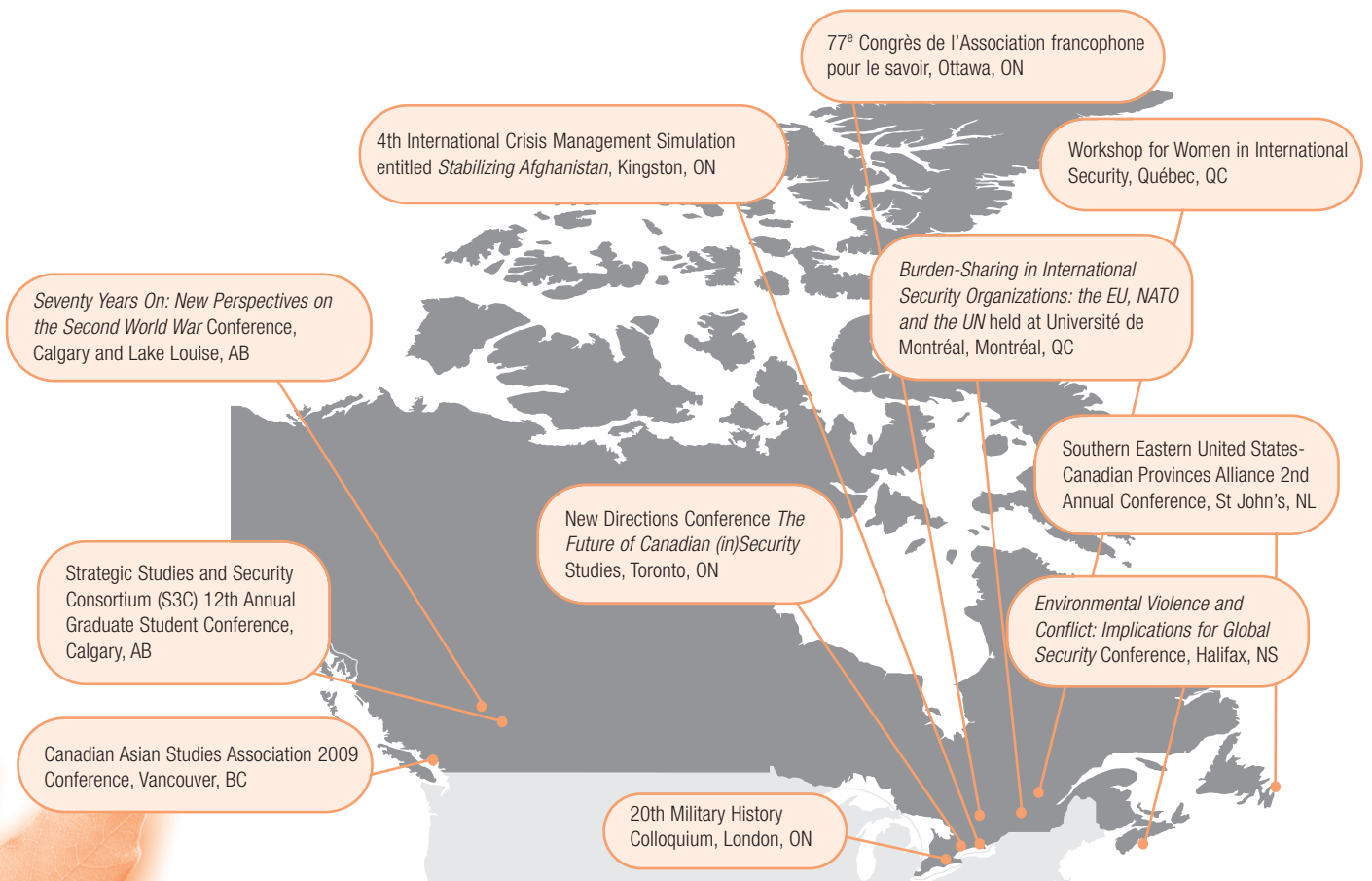

Each SDF Centre of Expertise is annually allocated \$5,000 to support travel for senior graduate students and junior faculty to allow them to participate in security and defence-related conferences across Canada.

In FY 09-10, the NCF was used 66 times, for a total disbursement of \$43,095.

Participants funded by the NCF traveled to conferences from coast to coast as detailed in Appendix E.

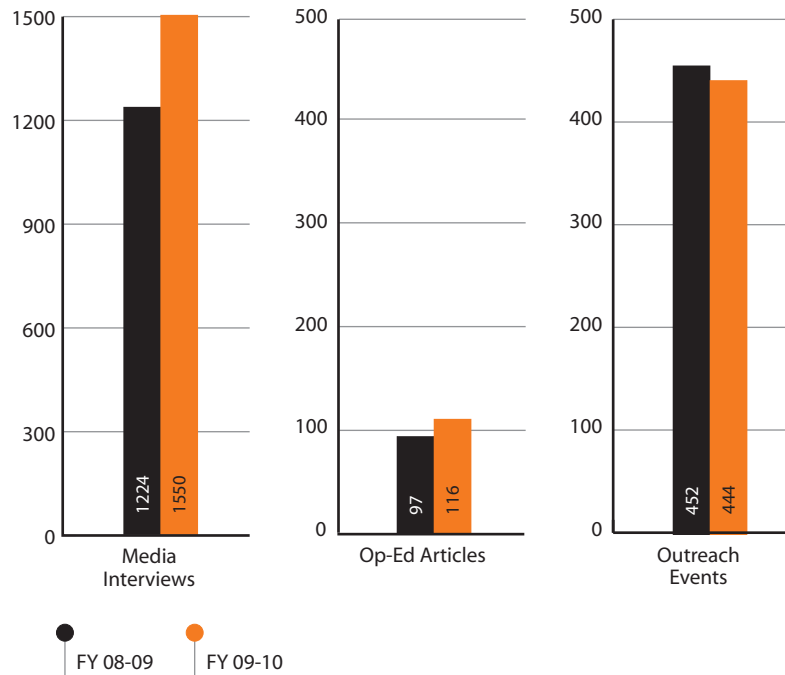


Public Awareness and Communication

Through research, teaching and publications remain key aspects of the work of the academic community, as experts on security and defence issues they are often asked to share their perspectives with the community and Canadians at large. In 2009-10, SDF Centres and the Chair participated in a variety of events, conferences and media engagements.

Overall, the Centres and the Chair organized or sponsored 444 events, reaching more than 18,000 people. They also conducted over 1,550 media interviews and produced nearly 116 Op-ed articles on a wide range of topics.

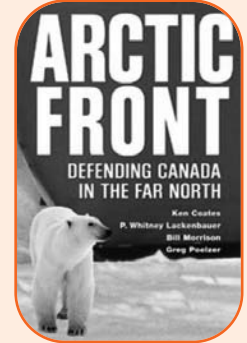

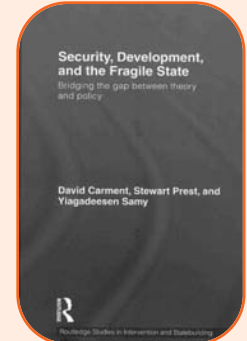
