It includes information on per capita population and gender breakdowns for the 2009 reporting year, as well as regulatory information and counts for 2002, 2005 and 2009.

CIHI attempts to collect data from each province and territory in Canada. In many cases, however, data providers combined data for Nunavut and the Northwest Territories or for all three of the country's territories. Canada's Health Care Providers—2009 Provincial Profiles: A Look at 24 Health Occupations focuses on the 10 provinces, while data on the territories is included in the nationwide totals.
