# **Stocks of Frozen and Chilled Meats**




# April 2011

## **Highlights**

- Stocks of frozen and chilled red meat in cold storage totalled 73 468 metric tonnes in April, down 12% from April 2010, while the stocks of poultry meat were relatively unchanged from a year earlier at 61 781 metric tonnes.
- Compared with January 2011, stocks of frozen and chilled red meat in cold storage were up 5% and the stocks of poultry meat were up 18%.

### **Methodology**

This bulletin presents data on stocks of frozen and chilled meats at the wholesale level obtained from a quarterly census of known cold storage establishments registered with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. Included are such facilities as meat packers, wholesale butchers, abattoirs, and central warehouses of large retail grocery stores. Data not received in time for publication for the current period are estimated through imputation until such time as actual data are available. Therefore, current quarterly data are preliminary and subject to revision.
