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OVERVIEW OF THE CANADIAN FRUIT SECTOR

A wide range of fruits are grown commercially in Canada, including apples, tender fruits (apricots, peaches, nectarines, pears, plums, prunes and cherries), grapes, blueberries, cranberries, strawberries and raspberries. A number of these fruits are native to Canada such as cranberries, blueberries, blackberries, saskatoons and the labrusca grape. Canada's fruit industry has adapted well to our cold climate and short growing seasons, with Southern Ontario and Southwest British Columbia, which enjoy about 180 frost-free days every year, producing much of the fruit grown in the country, while regions of Quebec and the Maritimes also have significant fruit production, despite having only about 120 frost-free days per year.

In 2011, the fruit industry saw mixed growth with overall increases in fruit farm area in every province except Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, despite decreasing in growing area for sour cherries, labrusca grape, and apples, which fell by 14.2%, 5.7% and 2.7% respectively. Low-bush (also referred to as 'wild') blueberry, sweet cherry and peach farm area conversely showed strong growth at 4.7%, 14.8% and 4.2%. Total marketed value grew in 2011 by 14.4% nationally, up \$94.57 million from 2010 to \$753.51 million, mainly due to an increase of almost \$57 million in Quebec and to an increase of \$27 million in BC's fruit marketed value.

Fruit farm cash receipts, (the total cash income received from the sale of fruit commodities as well as direct payments made to support the agricultural sector) rose in every province, except in Alberta and Ontario which decreased by 23.9% and 2.1% respectively. Fruit farm cash receipts in Quebec had the highest year-over-year increase among all provinces, growing by 41.3% to \$170.17 million. Much of the total growth across Canada can be attributed to the strength of the blueberry industry, which saw a rise in farm cash receipts of 38.2%, or \$56.16 million. After two years of decline, overall fruit farm cash receipts have effectively recovered to 2008 levels with a total of \$747.65 million being recorded in 2011.

With an increase in production, exports also grew significantly in 2011. Fresh fruit exports to the United States grew by 14.4% to \$303.49 million, which represents an increase of \$38.11 million over the previous year, but is still lower than the high of \$338.58 million reached in 2008. Fresh fruit exports to Japan and the Netherlands have rebounded similarly, reaching \$34.62 million and \$25.1 million respectively. Overall, the United States is Canada's largest fruit export destination, receiving 59% of the total Canadian fruit exports. Blueberries (high-bush and low-bush) are Canada's largest exported fruit, with close to \$82 million of fresh and \$254 million of frozen blueberries.

Canada continues to be a net importer of fresh fruit, drawing the majority of the total from the United States, which contributes 49.5% of Canada's fresh imported fruit, valuing just under \$2 billion in 2011. Other significant sources of fruit imports are Mexico, Chile and Costa Rica amounting to \$371 million, \$346 million and \$186 million respectively. Bananas continue to be the most imported fruit for 2011, as just over 506,000 tonnes came into Canada, valued at nearly \$400 million. The largest import by value was grapes, worth \$406 million at just under 180,000 tonnes.

Overall, Canada's fruit imports have continued to grow at a faster rate than the country's fruit exports. Total fruit imports increased by 10.59% in 2011, while exports increased by 27.55%, leading to a year-over-year increase of 8.61% in Canada's fruit trade deficit (exports less imports) which reached \$6.5 billion. The country's fruit trade deficit in 2011 was the highest in the last five years and follows an ever-increasing, long-term trend.




















Canadian Fruit Imports, 2007 – 2011




