

URMULE UPDATE

User Requested Minor Use Label Expansion (URMULE) Registrations August 1 - November 19

The URMULE Update provides timely information on the latest proposals for minor use label expansion of pesticides that have been evaluated and accepted for registration.

For the following pesticides, a Certificate of Registration has been issued based on a Supplemental Label, making the use legal. Registrants are required to add the new use to the full product label at the next printing. Provincial authorities, in publishing recommendations on the use of pesticides, may incorporate such acceptable uses in the knowledge that they meet the requirements of the *Pest Control Products Act*.

Tree Fruits

Clopyralid (Lontrel 360 -DowElanco), registration number 23545 for perennial vetch control on bearing and non-bearing apple trees.

Vegetables

Vinclozalin (Ronilan DF - BASF), registration number 22981, for the control of lettuce drop on lettuce.

Chlorpyrifos (Lorsban 4E - DowElanco), registration number 14879, for the control of cabbage maggot on radish and Asian radish.

Myclobutanil (Nova 40W - Rohm & Haas), registration number 22399, to reduce the PHI from 3 to 2 days for the control of powdery mildew and gummy stem blight on greenhouse cucumbers.

Napropramide (Devrinol 50DF - Zeneca), registration number 22885 for weed control on direct seeded and transplanted cabbage, broccoli and cauliflower.

Grasses Grown for Seed

Propiconazole (Propiconazole 250E - Novartis), registration numer 24029 for Powdery Mildew control on Kentucky Bluegrass grown for seed
