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Overview

Canada is home to a wide variety of fruits that are grown for commercial use each year. Many of these fruits, including cranberries, blueberries, blackberries, and saskatoon berries, are native to Canada. Despite our cold climate and short growing season, the Canadian fruit industry saw steady growth in 2012.

In 2012, the cultivated area of fruit farms saw a decrease in provinces other than New Brunswick, Quebec, Alberta, and British Columbia. Growing areas for apples, pears and raspberries decreased by 3.4%, 8.6%, and 6.6% respectively while growing areas for blueberries, cranberries and grapes increased by 2.2%, 5.9%, and 2%. These trends indicate mixed growth. Overall, however, fruit farm cultivated area statistics showed a modest growth of 1.1%. Fruit marketed value also grew by 13% due to strong increases in the values of blueberries, cranberries, and grapes, which were up by 22%, 43%, and 12% from 2011. These gains were most evident in Quebec and British Columbia. In contrast, major fruit producing regions like Ontario and the Maritimes saw decreases in marketed value of fruit.

Fruit farm cash receipts rose in every province except for Prince Edward Island and Ontario where they decreased by 14% and 12% respectively. Overall, fruit farm cash receipts for Canada increased by 12% from 2011. This can be attributed to the strong blueberry industry, which saw its farm cash receipts increase by 22% from 2011. Total Canadian fruit farm cash receipts are valued at \$849 million, the highest they have been in the last five years.

With respect to trade, Canadian exports of fresh fruit continued their upward trend in 2012, up 19% from 2011 and 53% from 2010. All of Canada's major export commodities saw increases in export value except for hazelnuts and melons, which decreased greatly by 21.7% and 73.8% respectively. Blueberries continued to be Canada's largest fruit export in terms of value and volume.

Imports to Canada continued to increase to a five-year high of \$4.3 billion. This is an 8.6% increase from last year. All of Canada's major import commodities increased in value. Grapes, bananas, and strawberries continue to be among the most commonly imported goods to Canada.

















2.6. Fruit Farm Cash Receipts by Commodity – Percent Share, 2012




3.1. Number of New Products Launched in Canada under Sub-Category 'Fruit' 2008 – 2012






4.2. Canadian Fruit Imports, 2008 – 2012




