

PREFACE

The Major Field of Study User Guide on the Classification Structure was prepared by G. A. Mori, M. E. Lalonde, B. Burke and A. Baril of the Housing, Family and Social Statistics Division in order to document the essential procedures that were undertaken in the production of the 1986 Census field of study data. The information is intended to complement as well to encourage the utilization of this rich source of data on the stock of human capital in Canada. Many individuals within Statistics Canada, as well as Employment and Immigration Canada coding consultants, contributed to the production of this valuable data base. Those most directly involved included the following; from Statistics Canada: W. Clark, G. Harper, D. Holmes, J. Kirk, M. Labelle, J. McMillan, C. Sage; and from EIC: C. Armstrong, M. Ball, Y. Jomphe, D. Landry, M. Pay, J. Sullivan, G. Suppes and J. Veilleux. Finally, we wish to acknowledge the source of many of the ideas for the MFS classification in the works of the late Zoltan Zsigmond who conducted the most comprehensive statistical surveys and analyses of the flow of human capital in Canada.

A Major Field of Study User Guide on Data Processing and Validation is projected to be completed in 1991. It will contain further meta-data information such as edit and imputation rules and concordance tables linking the Census MFS classification to other classificatory systems such as USIS (University Student Information System), CCSIS (Community College Student Information System) and ISCED (International Standard Classification of Education). It will also contain selected data comparisons that were utilized to validate the Census MFS data against some previously collected survey and census data.

MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY USER GUIDE

1. Introduction

The main purpose of this User Guide to the new 1986 Census of Canada information on the major field of study (MFS) of a person's highest postsecondary degree, certificate or diploma⁽¹⁾ is to provide the user with some background information that will aid in the effective utilization, application and interpretation of the MFS data.

The addition of the major field of study question to the 1986 Census 20% sample questionnaire was based on a trade-off with the question on school attendance. (2) The rationale for this was that more data on the quality and the stock of human capital would be required to provide for manpower planning and training programs in the 1980s. Prior to 1986, stock data on specialization or major field of study were available from the following sources:

- the 1971 Census data on vocational training and apprenticeship;
- the 1973 postcensal Highly Qualified Manpower Survey;
- the 1978 and 1984 National Graduate survey (based on University and College graduation data);
- the 1982 Current Population Profile labour force survey supplement.

These data were not collected in a periodic nor a standardized fashion and therefore it has been difficult thus far to arrive at a systematic view of the volume and flow of human capital in Canada. The new 1986 Census data on major field of study (MFS) complements these previous sources. Moreover it allows for a great deal of analysis at varying geographic levels and in conjunction with a number of socio-economic variables such as labour force activity, occupation, industry and income.

2. The 1986 Census MFS Question/Instructions

The choice of wording of the 1986 Census question was based on precedents from the above-mentioned surveys. The term "field of study" appeared to be one that is readily understood by most respondents. However, there was some difficulty in respondents understanding or application of this concept to the trades certificate category. The latter was included within the rubric of "postsecondary" qualifications and it seems that the concept of "field of study" may be less germane to certain trades certificates than, say, either the concepts of training or apprenticeship. Nevertheless, the vast majority of responses to the MFS question were consistent and classifiable, and the data appear to be very reliable. The data collection instruments for the 1986 MFS data were questions 22 and 23 from the 2B sample questionnaire (Chart 1).

The 2B questions were, for more than 95% of respondents, answered in a self-enumeration format. If respondents had difficulty with the questionnaire they were instructed to consult the guide booklet that accompanied the questionnaire (Chart 2).

The major field of study question asked for the respondent to specify that field as it pertains to the respondent's highest degree, certificate or diploma, excluding the secondary school graduation certificate. The determination of the qualification was implicitly based on the hierarchy or ordering of qualifications in question 22. Thus if a respondent had more than one postsecondary qualification, then the one with the highest-numbered check-box would be the one for which major field of study would be reported.

Question 23

Be as specific as possible in indicating a subfield of specialization within a broader discipline or area of training, especially in the case of graduate studies or other advanced training.

If you have earned more than one highest degree, certificate or diploma (e.g., two bachelor's degrees or two master's degrees), then indicate the major field of study for the one that was most recently conferred.

If you have specialized in more than one major field of study in your degree, certificate, or diploma, then indicate the one in which you experienced the greatest degree of specialization (e.g., the field in which you received the most number of courses or credits).

Also, as stated in the Guide instructions if the respondent had earned more than one degree, certificate or diploma at the same level, then they were instructed to report the field of study for the one most recently conferred. If the respondent had actually specialized in two or more different fields of study for the same qualification, then they were instructed to report the field of study in which the greatest degree of specialization was experienced (e.g., the field with the most number of credits). Notwithstanding these special instructions vis-à-vis multiple major fields of study, there was expected to be a number of dual majors to be reported. However, as it proved to be virtually impossible to code and to account for the large number of combinations, only a selected few dual major fields of study were retained on the data base. These multiple majors were restricted to the following cases: agricultural economics; economic geography; historical and political geography; physical geography; biochemistry (or biology and chemistry); biophysics (or biology and physics); physical chemistry; geophysics and geomorphology; astrophysics and astronomy; and chemical physics. Apart from these exceptions, all of the remaining fields of study reflect more or less singular domains or disciplines with fairly well established and defined contents and methodologies.

3. Definition

The formal definition of major field of study in the 1986 Census Reference Dictionary (99-101E) is shown in Chart 3.

Chart 3: Definition for Major Field of Study from the 1986 Census Dictionnary.

SCHOOLING: MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY (MFS)

Refers to the predominant discipline or area of learning or training of a person's highest postsecondary degree, certificate or diploma. The major field of study classification structure consists of 10 broad or major categories - educational, recreational and counselling services; fine and applied arts; humanities and related fields; social sciences and related fields; commerce, management and business administration; agricultural and biological sciences/technologies; engineering and applied sciences; engineering and applied science technologies and trades; health professions, sciences and technologies; and mathematics and physical sciences. This structure is, in turn, subdivided into over 100 "minor" classification categories and over 450 "unit" groups. The final number of "unit" groups may be reduced depending on the counts observed.

Censuses:

1986 (1/5 sample), 1971 (1/3 sample) - vocational training and apprenticeship only.

Reported for:

Population 15 years of age and over with a postsecondary degree, certificate or diploma, excluding institutional residents.

Responses:

See Appendix F for the classification structure.

Remarks:

The classification structure of the MFS variable can be used either independently or in conjunction with the SCHOOLING: HIGHEST DEGREE, CERTIFICATE OR DIPLOMA variable. When the latter is utilized with MFS, it should be noted that each of the postsecondary qualifications ranging from the trades certificate or diploma to earned doctorate display differing patterns or distributions. Therefore, varying disaggregations of MFS can be employed based primarily on the numerical representativeness of unit groups within each level of qualification.

When the medical degree level of qualification is cross-classified with MFS, it is advisable to use the separate variable DEGREE IN MEDICINE, DENTISTRY OR VETERINARY MEDICINE rather than the code value for HIGHEST DEGREE. The reason for this is that the former variable indicates a medical degree regardless of whether master's or earned doctorate were also held. This variable also shows persons with combined medical and earned doctorate degrees.

It should also be noted that the field of study concept entails the notion of subfield or specialization. Respondents were instructed in the guide which accompanied the questionnaire to be as specific as possible in indicating a subfield of specialization within a broader discipline or area of training, especially in the case of graduate studies or other advanced training. The degree to which respondents answered according to this criterion is reflected in the frequency of counts for the MFS "unit" groups. In general, higher degrees of specialization tend to be reported for master's medical and earned doctorate degrees.

Finally, it should be noted that the MFS data base can be linked to other comparable data bases. The 1971 Census vocational and apprenticeship training is one. Others include the 1973 Highly Qualified Manpower Survey, the 1975 and 1984 Postsecondary Student Surveys, the 1978 and 1984 National Graduates Surveys, the 1982 Current Population Profile, the International Standard Classification of Education, and the annual enrolment data for graduates classified according to the University Student Information System and the Community College Student Information System.

4. The MFS Classification Structure

The 1986 Census MFS classification structure was developed by the authors through the amalgamation and consolidation of seven related but differing classification schemes. Five of these originated from previous and ongoing Statistics Canada education data series, one originated from the Employment and Immigration Canada's (EIC) publication, College and University Programs in Canada, and the last was drawn from the 1975 International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) developed by UNESCO. In the development of the present MFS classification system, we decided at the outset to have a single unified system, rather than to have different schemes for the various levels of educational qualifications. Not only did this simplify the procedure of developing a code book⁽³⁾, but it also proved to be the most effective means of systematically summarizing the mass of information related to education and training in general. The alternative approach of developing or adapting different schemes to the four basic qualification levels - trades, college or other non-university, university and medical - would have resulted in a cumbersome and overlapping network that would have created

editing complications for coders that could in turn have been very error-prone.

The resulting unified classification scheme has the one singular disadvantage in that it does not immediately appear to resemble any existing or standard educational classification. However, in point of fact the structure is actually parallel to both the USIS classification as well as the ISCED structure from which USIS is derived. The one advantage that the MFS classification has over other systems is that it reflects current educational programs reported or described by respondents on their own terms. The last point is quite important as there tends to be an institutional lag when dealing with administratively reported information (i.e., the terminology tends to reflect older or established as opposed to newly formed or developing fields of study).

The present classification system for major field of study is, therefore, a consolidation of previously existing systems and reflects a fairly current nomenclature. The seven related classification systems from which the MFS system is derived are:

- the 1971 Census Vocational Training and Apprenticeship data which related to over 1,500 entries and was in turn aggregated into 99 minor unit groups and 19 major groups;
- the 1973 Highly Qualified Manpower Survey (HQMS) which related to a post-censal sub-sample of 1971 university graduates and which contained 99 unit codes and 8 major groups;
- the Education, Culture and Tourism Division's (ECTD) University Student Information System (USIS) containing 143 unit codes and the same 8 major groups as the HQMS;
- the ECTD's Community College Student Information System (CCSIS) containing 345 unit codes and several intermediate levels of aggregation;
- the 1982 Labour Force Survey Supplement (August) Current Population Profile (CPP) which in contrast to the previous four data series is addressed to the full range of educational qualifications and does so within a single classification scheme, thus providing a precedent for the unitary MFS structure; the CPP, however, was administered as a small random Labour Force Survey sub-sample and was capable of sustaining only 15 unit (major-level) codes;
- the publication produced by the Employment Support Services Branch of EIC entitled College and University Programs in Canada which organizes its information according to an occupationally oriented pattern derived from the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) and which identifies 168 unit groups and 23 major groups;
- the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) produced by UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) which is a complex multi-level scheme but which nonetheless is capable of being reduced and presented in a unitary form; educational field of study statistics from the Australian census have been organized under ISCED.

The overall structure of the 1986 Census MFS classification contains three systematic levels of aggregation, similar to the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) and the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). It does not, however, contain a four digit code structure as in the SOC or the SIC. Rather, the first two levels of aggregation are represented as nominal categories and the third level contains a three-digit numerical code that corresponds to the original data capture codes. A three-digit sequential and numerical (001-485) coding operation was applied to the MFS question. It was the least number of digits required thus making the data capture more efficient and less prone to coding error. After the data were captured, edited and weighted, preliminary analysis revealed that a number of fields of study had very low frequencies. In order to ensure that the final data base would contain MFS data that would meet normal Statistics Canada's reliability and confidentiality requirements, the MFS codes with frequencies that fell below a minimal cut-off point of 250 persons (weighted at the Canada level) were collapsed into contiguous or related fields. The cut-off point was methodologically selected on the basis of analysis of the standard error for cell sizes less than 250 (disaggregated by sex and province) as well as a comparison for procedures used for other census data such as occupation and income. This procedure resulted in a reduction of 52 fields of study. Users interested in which fields were reduced can compare the present MFS classification with that of the MFS code classification structure published in the 1986 Census Reference Dictionary (99-101E).

As stated previously, the MFS like the SOC and the SIC has three main levels of aggregation (although of course many other forms of aggregation are possible). At the highest or most generic level there are ten broad or major categories:

- 1 Educational, Recreational and Counselling Services
- 2 Fine and Applied Arts
- 3 Humanities and Related Fields
- 4 Social Sciences and Related Fields
- 5 Commerce, Management and Business Administration
- 6 Agricultural and Biological Sciences/Technologies
- 7 Engineering and Applied Sciences
- 8 Engineering and Applied Science Technologies and Trades
- 9 Health Professions, Sciences and Technologies
- 10 Mathematics and Physical Sciences

Users familiar with the HQMS, USIS or ISCED classification systems will note the general similarity with this classification. The main difference in the MFS classification is the addition of two broad generic categories - Commerce, Management and Business Administration (which was previously situated in the Social Sciences and related group in the HQMS/USIS/ISCED systems); and Engineering and Applied Science Technologies and Trades which was originally a part of the Engineering and Applied Sciences group. The main rationale for the addition of these two generic groups is first of all their distinctiveness vis-à-vis the other generic groups and secondly the empirical fact of the vast proliferation of programs and courses in these two areas in Canadian postsecondary institutions over the past ten to fifteen years. The Applied Science Technologies and Trades group represents the largest single generic aggregate accounting for 24% of major fields of study of persons with postsecondary qualifications. The second largest group is the Commerce, Management and Business Administration group at 23%. Together, these two groups represent 46%, or almost half, of all postsecondary graduates.

At the second or intermediate level of aggregation there are 110 "minor" groups, each of which are subsumed or "nested" under one of the ten generic or broad groups. These minor groups refer to more specifically defined sub-groups which, in turn, are for the most part subject to further differentiation. A schematic overview of the relationship between the first two levels of aggregation is shown in Chart 4. In terms of actual data utilization, it is expected that much of the analysis of the MFS data will take place at the generic and the intermediate minor group levels. This would especially apply to analyses of the MFS data in conjunction with some or all of the following census socio-economic variables.

- sex and MFS
- age groups and MFS
- occupation, industry, labour force activity, income and MFS
- geography and MFS
- mobility and MFS
- cultural factors (language, ethnicity and immigration) and MFS
- disability and MFS

Finally, at the third or most detailed level of aggregation, there are 428 unit groups arranged within the minor group categories. Their order within the minor groups is for the most part alphabetical (in English only). These unit groups represent the most specific delineation of major fields of study and can in general be regarded as subfields or specializations. The MFS data at the unit level should be approached with a slight degree of caution. Although persons reporting specific (as opposed to generic) fields are counted or enumerated as such, it is not known whether all respondents who actually did indeed specialize in a subfield reported themselves. As such, for example, although there is a tendency for the more specialized fields to be reported by persons at graduate degree levels (e.g., masters and earned doctorates), it is also true that some persons with graduate degrees reported their fields of study at higher or more generic levels of fields of study. The unit groups, then, can be analyzed as sub-groups in their own right, or they can be used as building blocks to create higher levels of aggregation such as at the minor or generic levels.

5. The MFS Classification and Its Relationship to the Highest Degree, Certificate or Diploma Variable

Each of the unit field of study groups in the MFS classification structure has a specific relationship to the highest degree, certificate or diploma variable. There are four specific ways in which a given MFS unit group can relate to a given type of postsecondary qualification.

- (i) The first possibility is that a given unit field of study can be represented by all postsecondary qualifications;
- (ii) The second possibility is that a given unit field of study can be represented only by trades or other nonuniversity (college) certificates or diplomas;
- (iii) the third possibility is that a given unit field of study can be represented at the other non-university (college) certificate or diploma level as well as at the level of university certificates, diplomas or degrees;
- (iv) the fourth and final possibility is that a given unit field of study can only be represented at the level of university certificates, diplomas or degrees.

These relationships between MFS and the highest degree certificate and diploma variable were defined and established for the purposes of conducting consistency edits between these two sets of data. These relationships are indicated as follows on Chart 5 which reflects the final 1986 Census retrieval data base classification for MFS.

1. The Classified Index and Description of Major Fields of Study Unit Groups

The classified index is a listing of all of the reported write-in entries for the MFS question arranged or organized as sub-units or sub-elements within each unit major field of study. The classified index is derived from the alphabetical index (displayed in the second section) of Part II which in turn is a derivative of all of the listed entries in the MFS code books. The classified and the alphabetical indices presented in this User Guide update the material contained in the MFS code book (R-420) in two senses. First, it reduces or eliminates any entries that were not reported or observed in census questionnaires. And second it includes additional entries that were encountered in the referral operation which addressed unidentified entries and assigned them with pertinent MFS codes.

An added feature of the MFS classified index is that it contains brief descriptions of each unit major field of study, similar to those contained for occupation in the SOC and for industry in the SIC. These MFS description are based on descriptions found in current calendars and brochures of universities, colleges, trade schools, business schools, institutes of technology and other postsecondary educational institutions. Much of the terminology and the phraseology were taken directly from the calendars; in most cases, several descriptions from various institution were amalgamated to form a single description. It should be stressed that the main purpose of these descriptions is to indicate the substantive core of each field so that similar or like fields can be distinguished from one another. The descriptions are not intended to be definitions as such. For example, it is known that the content, methodology and substance of fields of study and training vary over time and across educational institutions. In brief, the present User Guide descriptions and classified index are meant to serve two purposes:

- (i) to provide users with a succinct, current and practical description of unit fields of study; and
- (ii) to indicate to users what actual empirical referents (or respondent-provided write-in information) were encountered in the answers to the 1986 Census question on major field of study.

Finally, it should be noted that the descriptions and the sub-elements reflected in the Classified Index will not necessarily be identical in the English and the French versions of the MFS User Guide. Although the French version parallels the English version, its contents will differ according to the differing emphases found in the course and field of study descriptions of French-speaking postsecondary educational institutions.

2. The Alphabetical Index

The Alphabetical Index is a straightforward alphabetical ordering of all of the reported MFS write-in entries encountered in the 1986 Census. It is in effect an edited version of the MFS Code Book, with non-reported or scarce entries deleted. As such, it constitutes a relatively complete record of the range of responses encountered in the 1986 Census. It should, however, be emphasized that this index is not a substitute for the MFS code book. Any future applications of the MFS code book should utilize the complete range of possible entries as well as the MFS entries appearing in the 1986 Census. In addition, the MFS code book should update its contents to include any new programs, or subfields or fields of specializations that have appeared since June, 1986.

The alphabetical index will be of most use to persons attempting to locate a specific entry either within a generic group level, a minor group level, or a unit group level (as elaborated in Part II, Section 1). The index will enable the user to quickly find a given description of a field of study and then to refer to section 1 for more details.
