Message from the Government Film Commissioner

In our five-year Strategic Plan for the National Film Board of Canada, we dedicated ourselves to transforming Canada's public producer into a world leader in the digital media age and to forging a new connection with Canadians.

Now, as we look back on fiscal year 2010–2011—the third year of our plan—we can see the results of this commitment, accomplished during challenging economic times thanks to the diligence and dedication of people across our organization.

As this annual report will document, 2010–2011 was a year in which the NFB succeeded in establishing itself as a leader in the interactive art and media forms of the 21st century. Our interactive media works captured many of the world's top awards, focusing global attention on Canadian innovation in untested areas, where Canada's private sector cannot afford to operate.

It was also a year in which we expanded our family of acclaimed mobile applications and our growing roster of online distribution partnerships, ensuring that Canadians everywhere can access the NFB.

The public response to our efforts has surpassed our expectations. Even without the massive marketing campaigns deployed by mainstream digital and media companies, we saw our online and mobile audience numbers surpass 20 million views in just two years.

Behind the scenes, we've been busy developing innovative processes for digitizing our collection, making these works available to Canadians across a growing number of platforms, while preserving Canada's audiovisual legacy for future generations.

We're working leaner and more efficiently, thanks to new technologies and management methods. Our streamlined administrative structure allows us to devote more resources to production and to fund our digitization efforts internally. We're opening micro-offices in more provinces, with NFB producers in place to work directly with local film and digital media makers and reflect the concerns of more Canadian communities.

A new relationship with Canadians

Digital technology is enabling us to connect with Canadians in new ways and bypass traditional distribution channels to forge a direct relationship with audiences in every region of the country—on the digital platforms of their choice.

In 2010–2011, we launched a range of mobile applications, building on the success of our iPhone app, named as one of the best apps of 2009 by iTunes Canada. As Android emerged as the world's number-one smartphone platform, we were ready with Canada's first Android film app.

We followed that up with our iPad app, launched on Canada Day, offering a way to access NFB works on the world's most popular tablet; and as the fiscal year drew to a close, we were back with version 2.0, with enhancements that would see this application named iPad App of the Week by iTunes Canada.

In the initial days of the 2011–2012 fiscal year, we also launched our first pre-loaded app, created in partnership with Research in Motion, for the BlackBerry PlayBook.

Meanwhile, the application that started it all for us—our iPhone app—continued to garner new audiences and awards last fiscal, winning the Grand Prize – Best Mobile Application at the Prix Boomerang, which recognize the best interactive media and websites in Quebec.

In schools, we added to our growing roster of agreements with education ministries, extending <NFB.ca> into more classrooms, providing the country's educators with quality Canadian resources at a time when nations around the world are embracing digital educational resources.

We also continued to expand our partnerships with the world's major online video portals, including a new agreement with < <a href="https://www.ncbeau.ncbea

Our online engagement with Inuit and northern peoples was also strengthened through the creation of an NFB Channel on ISUMA TV < isuma.tv>, an independent interactive network of Inuit and Indigenous multimedia launched by Igloolik Isuma Productions.

In e-cinema, we joined with the Shorefast Foundation and the Fogo Island Arts Corporation to launch the Fogo Island Film House: the first e-cinema facility in Newfoundland and Labrador and the first project of its kind in English Canada. This e-cinema facility was inaugurated, fittingly, with a screening of *The Children of Fogo Island*, Colin Low's 1967 classic from the Challenge for Change program, with the legendary director in attendance. We also introduced e-cinema partnerships with the Faculty of Arts and Science of the Université de Montréal (UdeM) and the Canada Aviation and Space Museum.

Our advancements in public engagement weren't restricted to digital platforms, either. In the past year, attendance at NFB community events has more than tripled, to over a quarter of a million people. We also continue to be an important source of support for Canada's official-language minority communities, having added new venues to our Rendez-vous de l'ONF en Acadie program, while serving as a major partner in the Rendez-vous de la Francophonie, a nationwide celebration of French culture that offered more than 140 free screenings of NFB films in 62 Canadian cities.

In the fall of 2010, I began a tour of Canadian communities, meeting with the Canadian public as well as local leaders to spread the word about our new level of accessibility. I was also there to listen, to hear the stories and concerns from communities large and small across Canada, and gain a better understanding of what Canada's public producer can do to better serve their needs.

To date, I've visited communities in the Maritimes, Central Canada, the Prairies and British Columbia. Part of an ongoing commitment to reach out to Canadians and address their priorities, the tour resumed in November 2011. In addition, the quarterly meetings of the Board of Trustees continued to be held in different communities and, in a first for the NFB, were held in June 2010 in Nunavut and Nunavik, where members of the Board and management met with young creators and community elders alike.

Pioneering the interactive art forms of the future

This year, NFB interactive works truly came into their own, as acclaimed productions like <u>Out My Window</u>, <u>Welcome</u> <u>to Pine Point</u> and <u>Ma tribu c'est ma vie (My Tribe Is My Life)</u> established the NFB and Canada as leaders in the art and media forms of the future.

The International Documentary Film Festival Amsterdam decided to create a new award to recognize excellence in digital storytelling, and its first-ever IDFA DocLab Award for Digital Storytelling went to *Out My Window* <nfb.ca/highrise/outmywindow>. Directed by Katerina Cizek, *Out My Window* would go on to receive more honours, including an International Digital Emmy Award in the category of Digital Program: Non-fiction, announced during MIPTV's opening night gala in Cannes, France, where the NFB was the sole Canadian nominee. It is also one of our first interactive productions to be licensed internationally, with a sale to Australian public broadcaster SBS.

Welcome to Pine Point became our first two-time Webby Award winner, in the categories of Documentary: Individual Episode and Netart, increasing the NFB's record of excellence at the Webbys to four awards in just four years. The first online interactive documentary from the Vancouverbased creative team The Goggles, a.k.a. Paul Shoebridge and Michael Simons, Welcome to Pine Point perfectly illustrates how the universal is in the particular: this story of a tiny former community in the Northwest Territories has touched hearts and garnered acclaim across Canada and around the world.

It was a year that saw the launch of acclaimed NFB interactive projects from Quebec. These works included **Sacrée Montagne** (Holy Mountain!), an interactive exploration of Montreal's iconic Mount Royal created by Gilbert Duclos and Hélène de Billy with Montreal-based web design firm Departement, and **Ma tribu, c'est ma vie**, Myriam Verreault's exploration of how music fans across Quebec are using the Web to forge new personal identities.

In all, 26 original web productions were released last year, and are now available at <<u>nfb.ca/interactive</u>>. Together, these works received a combined 21 awards and honours, and were visited by more than 500,000 web users.

Excellence in documentary and animation

In 2010–2011, our filmmakers, animators and producers created outstanding auteur animation, point-of-view documentaries and groundbreaking experimental works.

We marked Remembrance Day with screenings of **Enfants** de soldats (<u>Children of Soldiers</u>), a documentary by Claire Corriveau shot over the course of a troop deployment to Afghanistan that focused on the children of parents serving in the Canadian Forces. Director Raymonde Provencher offered a very different look at children and the military in **Grace**, *Milly*, *Lucy* ... **Child Soldiers**, documenting the little-known tragedy of girl soldiers in Uganda.

Barry Stevens' **Prosecutor** provided a behind-the-scenes look into the historic first trials of the International Criminal Court, as Prosecutor Luis Moreno-Ocampo and his team work to end impunity for perpetrators of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes, while

À la guerre comme à la guerre (War Is Not a Game), directed by Lode Desmet, traced the 150-year history of the Geneva Conventions.

Stéphanie Lanthier's **Les Fros** (**The Lumberfros**) explores a fascinating microcosm of Quebec society in the province's boreal forest, where native-born Quebecois work and live side-by-side with new immigrants. Directed by Charles Officer, **Mighty Jerome** chronicles the rise, fall and redemption of Canadian track and field star Harry Jerome, from his early days in North Vancouver, through three Olympics and an unequalled streak of records, to his sudden and tragic death.

NFB highlights in auteur animation included Andrea Dorfman's *Flawed*, at once an exploration of our own imperfections and a tribute to the art of animation. The film had its world premiere at Hot Docs—a rare honour for an animated film—before receiving awards at festivals across North America. Patrick Doyon, an alumnus of our Hothouse program for emerging animators, completed *Sunday/Dimanche*, which received a Special Mention at the 61st Berlin International Film Festival.

Anita Lebeau's **Big Drive**, taking audiences along on a family road trip across the Canadian Prairies, had its world premiere in Anita's hometown of Winnipeg, where it received the Youth Jury Award for Best Animated Short at the Freeze Frame International Film Festival for Kids of All Ages.

The Circus/Le cirque is Nicolas Brault's poignant, highly personal film about a young boy waiting to see his dying mother, and was honoured with the Public Award for Best Canadian Short Film at the Montreal World Film Festival.

filmmaker Ann Marie Fleming's adaptation of Bernice Eisenstein's acclaimed illustrated memoir, and was named one of the top ten Canadian films of the year by TIFF (Toronto International Film Festival).

The NFB's role as a creative laboratory for groundbreaking cinematic works was also on display at the Canada Pavilion at Expo 2010 in Shanghai, where over 6.4 million visitors were treated to *Glimpses: A Human View of the Living City*, directed by Jean-François Pouliot, showcasing Canadian urban life through more than 3,000 animated photos presented on a large-format, 150-degree screen. The NFB's participation at Expo 2010 continues a rich tradition of exhibiting Canadian audiovisual innovation at world fairs, one that dates back to Expo 67 in Montreal and the legendary multi-screen experience *In the Labyrinth*.

In Nicola Lemay's innovative *Les yeux noirs* (*Private Eyes*), 3D stereoscopic animation allows normally sighted people to "see in the dark," immersing them in the world as it is experienced by the visually impaired.

And for the third consecutive year, the NFB brought together acclaimed filmmakers and NFB producers to craft a series of short signature works honouring the laureates of the Governor General's Performing Arts Awards. Notably, for the first time, most of these films were online at <NFB.ca>just hours after the start of the gala at the National Arts Centre.

A sustainable commitment to the North

With Canada's North the focus of national and international attention as never before, the NFB is working with local partners to build sustainable community development projects and improve Inuit and northern peoples' access to NFB productions.

A key part of this effort is <u>Unikkausivut</u>: <u>Sharing Our Stories</u>, a DVD box set and web space that will bring together over a hundred new and classic NFB works to preserve and enrich Inuit history, language and culture. The project was created in collaboration with the Inuit Relations Secretariat of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada and the Government of Nunavut, and was guided by an advisory committee made up of members of key Inuit organizations from the four Inuit regions of Canada.

Among the NFB's other productions about the North are *Qimmit: A Clash of Two Truths* and *This Land* nfb.ca/thisland>, one of our acclaimed interactive works from 2010–2011, in which users accompany Canadian Rangers to the most northerly point of Canadian territory on a challenging expedition of more than 2,000 kilometres. The site was created by Dianne Whelan and Jeremy Mendes and designed by Wallop Creative, and is also available as a linear documentary by Whelan and in book form as *This Vanishing Land: A Woman's Journey to the Canadian Arctic*.

A Piksuk Media/NFB co-production directed by Ole Gjerstad and Inuit filmmaker Joelie Sanguya, **Qimmit:** A Clash of Two Truths explores how the mysterious disappearance of Inuit sled dogs in the 1950s left deep wounds across Canada's Arctic. The film was featured at

the Dreamspeakers and First Peoples' (Land InSights) Aboriginal film festivals, as well as at a special screening in Iqaluit.

The NFB is also committed to sustainable mentorship programs with Inuit artists and filmmakers, created in collaboration with local partners: initiatives like the Nunavut Animation Lab, a joint venture between the NFB and the Inuit Broadcasting Corporation to help emerging animators develop their craft, and **Stories from Our Land 1.0**, a week-long workshop for 29 emerging filmmakers from across Nunavut, organized by the NFB with the Nunavut Film Development Corporation.

Digital transformation

Our strides in interactive programming and accessibility have been powered by a sweeping digital transformation at the NFB. We've committed ourselves to digitizing the NFB collection—and what's more, to fully funding our digital shift through our operational budget.

Digitization is at the heart of our R&D activities, including a Media Asset Management implementation strategy that will enable us to meet the challenges of a fully digital production and distribution environment.

This work has also focused international attention on Canadian leadership in digital archiving and conservation, with the NFB invited to present our plan at key gatherings like the International Conference on Preservation of Digital Objects (iPRES) and the Society of Motion Picture and Television Engineers annual conference.

Organizational renewal

Embracing digital methods and workflows is also part of a broader organizational renewal at the NFB, for which we've introduced new management approaches and organizational practices.

Reducing our administrative costs has enabled us to channel more resources into production. We opened a micro-office in St. John's staffed by an NFB producer, allowing us to work more closely with film and digital media communities across Newfoundland and Labrador. We also laid the groundwork for a similar production office in Saskatchewan, which is now open, bringing the NFB closer to film and new media makers in Canada's fastest-growing province.

Setting new goals

When I set out a new strategic vision for the NFB three years ago, we committed ourselves to some ambitious goals. We proposed to put the NFB at the forefront of digital media innovation and to transform our connection with Canadians via unprecedented access to NFB works.

To make all that possible, we undertook a digital transformation, restructuring our operations to work more efficiently and be more responsive to the needs of Canadians.

Today, we're creating works that address the issues that matter to Canadians and mark key moments in the life of this country, now and for future generations. With thousands of digitized productions, and with millions of views and online experiences, we're reinventing Canada's public producer.

Our people have worked hard to meet these challenges and reach our objectives.

Now, we're preparing to raise the bar again.

Today, we're putting in place a plan designed to take the NFB from being a respected name in international media circles to a truly global media brand—one that all Canadians can identify with and be proud of.

We'll continue to be a source of interactive, documentary and animation programming that is unique and compelling, in form and content. And we'll match our creative excellence in programming with equally compelling marketing, to develop an ongoing engagement that maintains and builds our audiences.

Across the country, we're looking at how we can establish a neural nodal network of micro-offices, interactive spaces, e-cinema facilities and more, to bring together communities and new generations of artists. Beyond Canada, we're planning to expand our presence through carefully selected partnerships.

Even as revenues from conventional channels decline, we're projecting increased revenues, thanks to a detailed new business plan that understands and will exploit the opportunities provided by the digital revolution. Our transactional business model is up and running, with a hard launch scheduled for fall 2011. We're readying an enhanced educational offering, designed to take advantage of the move to digital educational media here in Canada and around the world. We're also looking at how to

restructure our business model so that the NFB can use its foundation as a creative laboratory to develop and spin off the media businesses of the future.

Remaining true to our mission

In light of all these changes, I think it's important to emphasize what *isn't* changing at Canada's public producer.

Even with all our new productions and initiatives across new platforms, we've remained true to the mission of the NFB. That means serving the needs of Canadians. It means clear priorities: identifying where we can make a positive difference and focusing our energies on areas that *can't* be developed by Canada's vibrant private sector.

The NFB is unique; there is no other institution like it in the world. Canadians have shown that they love and appreciate their Film Board. And we intend to make sure that we continue to earn that trust and affection by further serving Canadians and becoming an essential part of their lives, whether at home, school or work.

Financial Statements

Financial information submitted in the preparation of the Public Accounts of Canada, and included in the NFB's *Departmental Performance Report*, is consistent with these financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining an effective system of internal control over financial reporting designed to provide reasonable assurance that financial information is reliable, that assets are safeguarded and that transactions are properly authorized and recorded in accordance with the *Financial Administration Act* and other applicable legislation, regulations, authorities and policies.

Management seeks to ensure the objectivity and integrity of data in its financial statements through careful selection, training, and development of qualified staff; through organizational arrangements that provide appropriate divisions of responsibility; through communication programs

aimed at ensuring that regulations, policies, standards, and managerial authorities are understood throughout the NFB; and through conducting an annual assessment of the effectiveness of the system of internal control over financial reporting (ICFR).

An assessment for the year ended March 31, 2011, was completed in accordance with the *Policy on Internal Control* and the results and action plans are summarized in the annex.

The system of ICFR is designed to mitigate risks to a reasonable level based on an on-going process to identify key risks, to assess effectiveness of associated key controls, and to make any necessary adjustments.

Notes to Financial Statements

MARCH 31, 2011

1- AUTHORITY AND PURPOSES

The National Film Board was established in 1939 under the *National Film Act*, and is the agency responsible for administering the Act.

The National Film Board (the "Board") is a cultural agency named in Schedule 1.1 of the *Financial Administration Act* reporting to the Minister of Canadian Heritage and Official Languages. It is administered by a Board of Trustees appointed by the Governor in Council and chaired by the Government Film Commissioner.

The Board's legislative mandate is to initiate and promote the production and distribution of films in the national interest and, in particular:

- to produce and distribute and to promote the production and distribution of films designed to interpret Canada to Canadians and to other nations;
- to represent the Government of Canada in its relations with persons engaged in commercial motion picture film activity in connection with motion picture films for the Government or any department thereof;
- to engage in research in film activity and to make available the results thereof to persons engaged in the production of films;
- to advise the Governor in Council in connection with film activities;
- to discharge such other duties relating to film activity as the Governor in Council may direct it to undertake.

The Board is not subject to income taxes.

2- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Treasury Board accounting policies stated below, which are based on Canadian generally accepted accounting principles for the public sector. The presentation and results using the stated accounting policies do not result in any significant differences from Canadian generally accepted accounting principles, except as disclosed in Note 9 – Net Debt Indicator.

The most significant policies are as follows:

Parliamentary appropriations

Operations are funded through a permanent authority from Parliament (Revolving Fund) and Parliamentary appropriations voted annually.

The Revolving Fund allows the Board to make payments out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for working capital, interim financing of operating costs and capital assets acquisitions. This authority requires that the aggregate of admissible working capital and net book value of capital assets does not exceed \$15 million.

The Board is also financed in part by the Government of Canada through Parliamentary appropriations. The appropriations are voted annually to replenish the Revolving Fund for net acquisitions of capital assets and the admissible cost of operations. The basis of the appropriations provided to the Board does not parallel the accounting principles applied in preparing the financial statements since appropriations are primarily based on cash flow requirements. Consequently, items recognized in the statement of operations and the statement of financial position are not necessarily the same as those provided through appropriations from Parliament. Note 3 provides a reconciliation between the two bases of reporting.

Net cash provided by Government of Canada

The Board operates within the Consolidated Revenue Fund (CRF), which is administered by the Receiver General for Canada. All cash receipts are deposited to the CRF and all cash disbursements are paid from the CRF. The net cash provided by Government is the difference between all cash receipts and all cash disbursements including transactions with other Federal departments and agencies.

Due to (from) the Consolidated Revenue Fund

Due from the Consolidated Revenue Fund balance represents the amount of cash that the Board is entitled to draw from the CRF without further appropriations, in order to discharge its liabilities and the due to the Consolidated Revenue Fund balance represents the amount of cash that the Board has to pay to the CRF for the money received.

Expense recognition

All expenses are recorded on an accrual basis.

Vacation pay is expensed as the benefits accrue to employees under their respective terms of employment.

Production of films and other forms of visual presentations

All production costs are charged to operations in the year in which they are incurred and shown in the Statement of Operations as follows:

BOARD'S PROGRAM

All costs incurred for unsponsored productions and coproductions or other forms of visual presentations.

SPONSORED PRODUCTION AND PRE-SALE

Part of costs incurred for film productions and co-productions or other forms of visual presentations corresponding to sponsor's contribution. The excess of costs over the sponsor's contribution is charged to the Board's program.

Revenues

Revenues from the production of films and other forms of visual presentations are accounted for at an amount equal to the sponsored production and pre-sale costs during the year in which these costs are incurred. Any profit is recognized in the year the production is completed.

Royalty revenues are recognized once all of the Board's obligations have been fulfilled and its expenses have been accounted for, regardless of when the acquirer actually uses the work.

Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at amounts expected to be ultimately realized. A provision is made for external accounts receivable where recovery is considered uncertain.

Inventories

Materials and supplies are carried at cost.

Film prints and other forms of visual presentations held for sale are carried at the lower of cost and net realizable value. The cost of other prints is expensed on a current basis.

Capital assets

Capital assets are amortized according to the straight line method over the estimated useful life of the assets, as follows:

·Technical equipment from 4 to 10 years ·Software & data processing equipment from 5 to 10 years ·Office furniture, equipment and other ·Leasehold improvements from 5 to 10 years terms of the leases

The Board has a collection of nearly twenty thousand audiovisual works produced since 1895. This inestimable collection is not intended for sale and does not have a measurable value. It has, however, been assigned a nominal value of \$1 in the financial statements, appearing on the statement of financial position as capital assets to ensure that the reader is aware of its existence.

The Board enters into operating lease agreements to acquire the exclusive use of certain capital assets over the term of the lease. These rental fees are charged to operations in the year to which they apply. The Board also enters into capital lease agreements by which substantially all the benefits and risks inherent to ownership of the assets are transferred to the Board. The Board then records an asset and an obligation corresponding to the present value of the minimum lease payments, excluding the portion thereof relating to executory costs. The assets recorded from a capital lease agreement are amortized on the same basis as other assets owned by the Board and the obligations are amortized over the lease term.

Employee Future Benefits

PENSION BENEFITS

All eligible employees participate in the Public Service Pension Plan administered by the Government of Canada. The Board's contributions reflect the full cost as employer. This amount is currently based on a multiple of an employee's required contributions and may change over time depending on the financial situation of the Plan. The Board's contributions are expensed during the year in which the services are rendered and represent the total pension obligation of the Board. The Board is not currently required to make contributions with respect to any actuarial deficiencies of the Public Service Pension Plan.

SEVERANCE BENEFITS

Employees are entitled to severance benefits as provided for under labour contracts and conditions of employment. The cost of these benefits is accrued as employees render the services necessary to earn them. Management determined the accrued benefit obligation using a method based upon assumptions and its best estimates; such as, years of service, employee's status and historical profile of voluntary departures and layoffs in order to calculate the value of future payments. These benefits represent the only obligation of the Board that entails settlement by future payment.

Contingent liabilities

Contingent liabilities are potential liabilities which may become actual liabilities when one or more future events occur or fail to occur. To the extent that the future event is likely to occur or fail to occur, and a reasonable estimate of the loss can be made, an estimated liability is accrued and an expense recorded. If the likelihood is not determinable or an amount cannot be reasonably estimated, the contingency is disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

Measurement uncertainty

The preparation of these financial statements in accordance with the Treasury Board accounting policies, which are based on Canadian generally accepted accounting principles for the public sector, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that could affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses reported in the financial statements. At the time of preparation of these statements, management believes the estimates and assumptions to be reasonable. The most significant items for which estimates are used are the useful life of capital assets, allowances for doubtful accounts and the liability related to employee severance benefits. Actual results could significantly differ from those estimated. The estimates are reviewed periodically and as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in net cost of operations in the period in which they become known.

3- PARLIAMENTARY APPROPRIATIONS

The Board receives most of its funding through annual Parliamentary appropriations. Items recognized in the statement of operations and the statement of financial position in one year may be funded through Parliamentary appropriations in prior, current or future years. Accordingly, the Board has different net results of operations for the year on a government funding basis than on accrual accounting basis. The differences are reconciled in the following tables:

The above assets include equipment under capital leases for a total cost of \$1,937,494 (2010 – \$3,665,932) less accumulated amortization of \$673,715 (2010 – \$1,189,286). Current year amortization expenses relating to property under capital lease amount to \$661,076 (2010 – \$788,465). Acquisitions under capital leases amounted to \$316,383 (2010 – \$4,287).

5- EMPLOYEE FUTURE BENEFITS

Pension benefits

The Board and all eligible employees participate in the Public Service Pension Plan, which is sponsored and administered by the Government of Canada. Pension benefits accrue up to a maximum period of 35 years at a rate of 2% per year of pensionable service, times the average of the best five consecutive years of earnings. The benefits are integrated with Canada/Quebec Pension Plans benefits and they are indexed to inflation.

Both the employees and the Board contribute to the cost of the Plan. The 2011 expense amounts to \$3,530,238 (2010 - \$3,967,902), which represents approximately 1.9 times (2010 - 2.1 times) the contributions by employees.

The Board's responsibility with regard to the Plan is limited to its contributions. Actuarial surpluses or deficiencies are recognized in the financial statements of the Government of Canada, as the Plan's sponsor.

Severance benefits

The Board provides severance benefits to its employees based on eligibility, years of service and final salary. This benefit plan is not pre-funded and thus has no assets, resulting in a plan deficit equal to the accrued benefit obligation. Benefits will be paid from future appropriations. Information about the plan, measured as at March 31, 2011, is as follows:

7- OBLIGATION UNDER CAPITAL LEASES

The Board has entered into agreements to rent technical, data processing and office equipment under capital leases. The assets have been capitalized using imputed interest rates varying from 5% to 8%. The related obligations are paid over a 3-5 year lease term. Minimum lease payments totalled \$1,273,889 for the year ended March 31, 2011 (2010 – payments of \$1,010,601). Interest of \$81,224 (2010 – \$146,903) was charged to operations.

8- RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Board is related in terms of common ownership to all departments, agencies and Crown corporations created by the Government of Canada. The Board enters into transactions with these entities in the normal course of business in accordance with standard trade terms. During the year ending March 31, 2011, the Board leased accommodations from the Department of Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) for the amount of \$6,835,329 (2010 – \$7,037,091).

The Government has structured some of its administrative activities for efficiency and cost-effectiveness purposes so that one department performs these on behalf of all without charge. The costs of these services, which include payroll and cheque issuance services provided by Public Works and Government Services Canada, are not included as an expense in the Statement of Operations. The Board also receives audit services provided, free of charge, by the Office of the Auditor General.

9- NET DEBT INDICATOR

The presentation of the net debt indicator and a statement of change in net debt are required under Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

Net debt is the difference between a government's liabilities and its financial assets and is meant to provide a measure of the future revenues required to pay for past transactions and events. A statement of change in net debt would show changes during the period in components such as tangible capital assets, prepaid expenses and inventories. Departments are financed by the Government of Canada through appropriations and operate within the Consolidated Revenue Fund (CRF), which is administered by the Receiver General for Canada. All cash received by departments is deposited to the CRF and all cash disbursements made by departments are paid by the CRF. Under this government business model, assets reflected on the departmental financial statements, with the exception of the Due from the CRF, are not available to use for the purpose of discharging the existing liabilities of the department. Future appropriations and any respendable revenues generated by the department's operations would be used to discharge existing liabilities.

The Board is subject to various legal claims arising in the normal course of its operations. In management's view, the ultimate disposition of these claims is not expected to have a material impact on the financial statements.


