
Arizona exported \$377 million to Canada, including:

- → \$235M in vegetables (including \$58M in peppers)
- → \$74M in fruits and nuts (including \$34M in melons)
- → \$32M in food preparations*
- → \$9M in beverages
- → \$9M in dairy products

Arizona imported \$90 million from Canada, including:

- → \$15M in baked goods
- → \$12M in canola oil
- → \$7M in fresh/frozen meat (including \$5M in beef)
- → \$6M in beverages (including \$4M in whiskies)
- → \$6M in food preparations*

* The category "food preparations" includes products such as tea substitutes, vegetable preparations, flavoring extracts, powders and essences, milk or cream substitutes, jelly powders, and juices from concentrate.

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Arizona has benefited from this strong relationship

 with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from
 the U.S. in 2014, of which \$377M came from Arizona.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
