
GEORGIA EXPORTED \$395 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Georgia produces almost half of the peanuts produced in the United States each year, and is the number one U.S. exporter of these nuts. Canada is Georgia's top export market for peanuts, exporting \$54 million in peanuts to Canada in 2010. Furthermore, vegetable production in Georgia has increased significantly over the past 20 years. The onion is the state's top vegetable in terms of value. Georgia exported \$4.1 million in onions to Canada in 2010, making Canada Georgia's number one export market for this vegetable. The Georgia-Canada trading relationship has many facets that are mutually beneficial, ensuring that Georgia has an export market for their peanuts and vegetables, and that Canada is supplied with these high quality agricultural products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN GEORGIA

→ Approximately 249,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
