
## Georgia exported \$473 million to Canada, including:

- → \$79M in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- → \$76M in peanuts
- → \$37M in baked goods
- → \$32M in prepared chicken meat
- → \$28M in prepared cereal grains (including breakfast cereal)

## Georgia imported \$403 million from Canada, including:

- → \$65M in baked goods
- → \$58M in food preparations\*
- → \$54M in chocolate products
- → \$33M in canola oil
- → \$29M in prepared cereal grains (including breakfast cereal)

\* The category "food preparations" includes products such as tea substitutes, vegetable preparations, flavoring extracts, powders and essences, milk or cream substitutes, jelly powders, and juices from concentrate.

#### A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Georgia has benefited from this strong relationship

   with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from
   the U.S. in 2014, of which \$473M came from Georgia.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because
  of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada
  is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm
  machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
