
Hawaii exported \$19 million to Canada, including:

- → \$10M in fruits and nuts (including \$7M in papayas)
- → \$3M in roasted and non-roasted coffee
- → \$2M in queen bees
- → \$1M in medicinal plants
- → \$1M in chocolate-covered nuts

Hawaii imported \$8 million from Canada, including:

- → \$3M in non-durum wheat
- → \$2M in alcoholic beverages (including \$1M in beer)
- → \$1M in wheat and meslin flour
- → \$0.7M in pet feed
- → \$0.3M in fruit syrups

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Hawaii, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$19 million came from Hawaii.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
