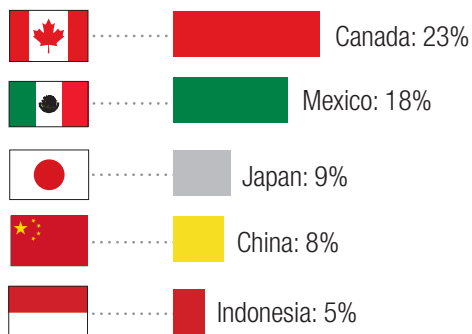
IDAHO EXPORTED \$147 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$21M in canola seeds
- \$14M in frozen fries
- \$11M in legumes
- \$11M in food preparations
- \$11M in proteins

IDAHO IMPORTED \$143 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$29M in canola meal
- \$17M in canola oil
- \$17M in beef
- \$12M in alfalfa seeds
- \$11M in brewing or distilling dregs

IDAHO'S TOP AGRICULTURAL EXPORT MARKETS



BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Idaho is one of the largest producers of alfalfa hay and is ranked third in the U.S. with 1.25 million acres dedicated to this crop. Canada supplies the state with the seeds needed to grow alfalfa, with seed imports from Canada totaling \$12 million in 2010. The alfalfa seeds are produced almost entirely in the prairie provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba. This complementary trade between Idaho and Canada helps support Idaho's position as a top producer of alfalfa hay.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN IDAHO

- Approximately 40,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
