
Idaho exported \$196 million to Canada, including:

- → \$27M in vegetables and legumes
- → \$26M in milk proteins
- → \$23M in seeds (including \$17M in canola seeds)
- → \$18M in food preparations (including \$2M in flavoring powders)
- → \$17M in prepared potatoes

Idaho imported \$228 million from Canada, including:

- → \$86M in canola meal
- → \$36M in canola oil
- → \$21M in live animals (including \$12M in live cattle)
- → \$18M in seeds (including \$14M in alfalfa seeds)
- → \$13M in dried distiller grains for animal feed

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Canada purchased \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2012. Idaho benefitted from this strong relationship in 2012 by exporting \$196 million in agriculture and agri-food products to Canada. To help reduce barriers to trade, lower costs and create economic opportunities, the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border Action Plans were released in December 2011. Increased regulatory cooperation will support U.S.-Canada trade in agriculture and agri-food products, contribute to job creation, and provide a greater variety of safe, high-quality food products for consumers.

Trade with Canada = Jobs in Idaho

→ Approximately 40,000 jobs in Idaho depend on trade with Canada.

All currency is in U.S. dollars and based on 2012 data (as of July 2013). All export figures do not include re-export values.

Trade values are approximate and have been rounded where/when appropriate. Fertilizers, farm machinery and seafood are not included in the definition of agriculture and agri-food trade.

Commodity categories are based on the internationally standardized Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS codes).

Wherein a single commodity is 90 percent or more of an HS group, the specific commodity is named.


