
Idaho exported \$215 million to Canada, including:

- → \$35M in seeds (including \$27M in canola seeds)
- → \$29M in vegetables and legumes (including \$4M in kidney beans)
- → \$26M in milk proteins
- → \$21M in food preparations (including \$2M in flavoring powders)
- → \$17M in prepared potatoes

Idaho imported \$240 million from Canada, including:

- → \$96M in canola meal
- → \$34M in canola oil
- → \$21M in seeds (including \$16M in alfalfa seeds for sowing)
- → \$21M in dried distiller grains for animal feed
- → \$13M in vegetables and legumes (including \$7M in mushrooms)

Idaho's top agriculture and agri-food export markets:



A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Idaho, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$215 million came from Idaho.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
