
Idaho exported \$215 million to Canada, including:

- → \$37M in processed potatoes (including fries and chips)
- → \$36M in vegetables (including \$18M in beans and peas)
- → \$36M in canola seeds
- → \$28M in peptones and other proteins
- → \$11M in food preparations*

Idaho imported \$245 million from Canada, including:

- → \$80M in canola meal
- → \$24M in canola oil
- → \$23M in dried distiller grains
- → \$21M in fresh/frozen beef
- → \$17M in seeds used for sowing (including \$14M in alfalfa seeds)

* The category "food preparations" includes products such as tea substitutes, vegetable preparations, flavoring extracts, powders and essences, milk or cream substitutes, jelly powders, and juices from concentrate.

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Idaho has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2014, of which \$215M came from Idaho.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
