
ILLINOIS EXPORTED \$1 BILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

ILLINOIS IMPORTED \$1.5 BILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$241M in breads and pastries
- → \$154M in sugar confectionery
- → \$122M in chocolate products
- → \$108M in food preparations
- → \$107M in canola oil

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Illinois and Canada have an important bilateral trade partnership in confectionery items (sugar-type candy, gum, chocolate candy and cocoa ingredients). Canada is the largest market for U.S. consumer food products. In 2010, Illinois exported \$50 million in chocolate products and \$49 million in sugar confectionery (sugar candy, marshmallows and chewing gum) to Canada. Illinois imported \$154 million in sugar confectionery (sugar candy and chewing gum), and \$13 million in sugars from Canada. With this bilateral trade relationship both residents of Canada and Illinois are able to satisfy their sweet tooth.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN ILLINOIS

→ Approximately 340,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
