
Illinois exported \$1.3 billion to Canada, including:

- → \$156M in food preparations (including \$42M in chewing gum)
- → \$122M in breads and pastries
- → \$107M in prepared meat (including \$42M in sausages)
- → \$105M in fats and oils
- → \$75M in chocolate products

Illinois imported \$1.7 billion from Canada, including:

- → \$266M in breads and pastries
- → \$203M in fats and oils
- → \$139M in candy
- → \$137M in chocolate products
- → \$103M in food preparations (including syrups and concentrates)

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Illinois, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$1.3 billion came from Illinois.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
