**AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$918 MILLION IN 2014**

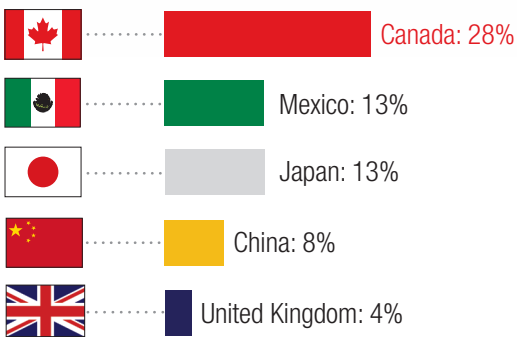
**Indiana exported \$394 million to Canada, including:**

- \$62M in mixes, doughs, and malt extracts
- \$53M in infant food
- \$48M in beverages
- \$47M in corn seeds
- \$32M in food preparations\*

**Indiana imported \$524 million from Canada, including:**

- \$84M in baked goods
- \$75M in canola oil
- \$63M in chocolate products
- \$23M in canola meal
- \$22M in mixes, doughs, and malt extracts

**A Strong Partnership in Trade:**

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Indiana has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2014, of which \$394M came from Indiana.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
