Let's keep a good thing growing!



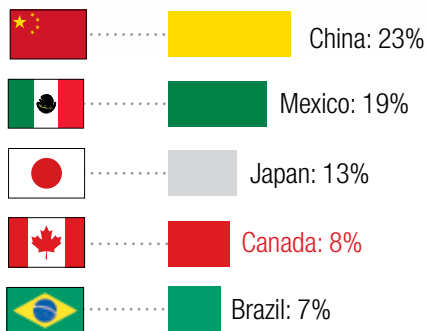
Kansas exported \$405 million to Canada, including:

- \$175M in fresh/frozen beef
- \$107M in pet feed
- \$39M in coffee extracts
- \$17M in wheat or meslin flour
- \$10M in prepared potatoes

Kansas imported \$128 million from Canada, including:

- \$21M in pet feed
- \$18M in non-durum wheat
- \$18M in fats and oils (including \$13M in canola oil)
- \$10M in live animals (including \$8M in cattle)
- \$6M in crushed or hulled oats and meal

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Kansas' meat processing facilities and Canada's livestock outputs proved mutually beneficial in 2013 as Canadian ranchers supplied Kansas with \$8 million of cattle and Kansas exported \$175 million of fresh/frozen beef to Canada. Kansas' efficiency in meat processing provides Canadians with a variety of meat products at competitive prices, while Canadian exports allow processing plants in Kansas to operate at full capacity. Canada and the U.S. are each other's most important trading partners. This relationship is increasingly significant as U.S.-Canada trade and integration mutually strengthens our competitive position in the changing global marketplace.
