Let's keep a good thing growing!



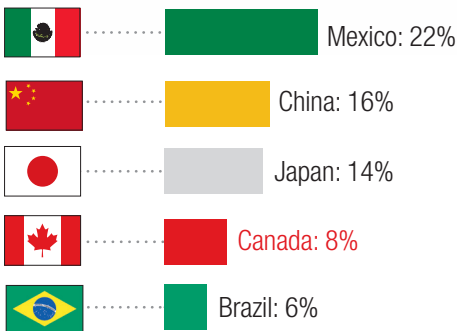
Kansas exported \$375 million to Canada, including:

- \$143M in fresh/frozen meat (including \$123M in beef)
- \$107M in animal feed (including \$98M in dog and cat food)
- \$45M in coffee-based products
- \$11M in processed potatoes (including fries and chips)
- \$8M in baked goods

Kansas imported \$169 million from Canada, including:

- \$48M in wheat
- \$20M in live animals (including \$12M in cattle)
- \$20M in dog and cat food
- \$14M in canola oil
- \$7M in chocolate products

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Keep trade moooving! Kansas' meat processing facilities and Canada's livestock outputs proved mutually beneficial in 2014. Canadian ranchers supplied Kansas with \$12M of cattle and Kansas exported \$143M of fresh/frozen beef to Canada in 2014. Kansas' efficiency in meat processing provides Canadians with a variety of meat products at competitive prices, while Canadian exports allow processing plants in Kansas to operate at full capacity. Canada and the U.S. are each other's most important trading partners. This relationship is increasingly important as U.S.-Canada trade and integration mutually strengthens our competitive position in the changing global marketplace.
