
Kentucky exported \$181 million to Canada, including:

- → \$34M in alcoholic beverages (including \$19M in whiskey)
- → \$25M in breads and pastries (including \$10M in pies and cakes)
- → \$20M in peanut butter
- → \$17M in tomato sauces
- → \$12M in gouda cheese

Kentucky imported \$223 million from Canada, including:

- → \$112M in alcoholic beverages (including \$75M in whiskey)
- → \$21M in breads and pastries (including \$3M in cookies)
- → \$12M in chocolate products
- → \$11M in vegetables and legumes (including \$4M in peppers)
- → \$9M in food preparations (including \$3M in syrups and concentrates)

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Kentucky, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$181 million came from Kentucky.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
