Louisiana exported \$76 million to Canada, including:

- → \$45M in roasted coffee
- → \$7M in sauces and condiments
- → \$6M in rice
- → \$3M in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- → \$3M in frozen vegetables

Louisiana imported \$89 million from Canada, including:

- → \$38M in canola oil
- → \$22M in alcoholic beverages (including \$16M in whiskey)
- → \$11M in non-durum wheat
- → \$6M in breads and pastries (including \$2M in biscuits)
- → \$3M in frozen fries

Celebrating 20 Years of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA)!

- 2014 marks the 20th anniversary of when NAFTA came into force.
- NAFTA establishes the world's largest trading agreement.
- Since coming into force in 1994, NAFTA has quadrupled trade in agriculture and agri-food and seafood products between Canada, United States and Mexico.
- NAFTA has provided North American producers and processors with a larger and more diversified market, and consumers with a greater variety of safe, healthy, and wholesome food products at a competitive price.

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- The U.S., and in particular Louisiana, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2013 and \$76 million from Louisiana specifically.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
