

# MARYLAND-CANADA

**AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$300 MILLION IN 2012**

*Let's keep a good thing growing!*



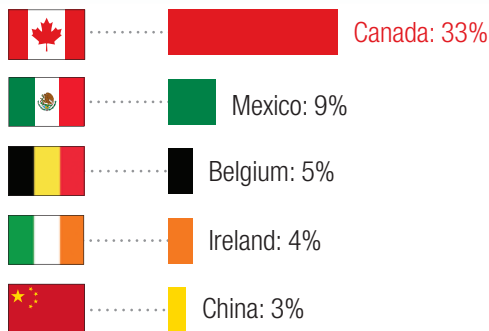
**Maryland exported \$95 million to Canada, including:**

- \$20M in prepared fruits and nuts (including \$12M in cashews)
- \$12M in ground pepper
- \$11M in vegetables and legumes (including \$9M in lettuce and chicory)
- \$9M in animal by-products (including \$8M in by-products for production of animal feed)
- \$4M in sauces and condiments

**Maryland imported \$205 million from Canada, including:**

- \$33M in frozen fries
- \$33M in vegetables and legumes (including \$5M in tomatoes)
- \$24M in sauces and condiments
- \$20M in breads and pastries
- \$13M in alcoholic beverages (including \$10M in whiskey)

**A Strong Partnership in Trade:**

Canada purchased \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2012. Maryland benefitted from this strong relationship in 2012 by exporting \$95 million in agriculture and agri-food products to Canada. To help reduce barriers to trade, lower costs and create economic opportunities, the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border Action Plans were released in December 2011. Increased regulatory cooperation will support U.S.-Canada trade in agriculture and agri-food products, contribute to job creation, and provide a greater variety of safe, high-quality food products for consumers.

**Trade with Canada = Jobs in Maryland**

→ Approximately 156,000 jobs in Maryland depend on trade with Canada.

All currency is in U.S. dollars and based on 2012 data (as of July 2013).  
All export figures do not include re-export values.  
Trade values are approximate and have been rounded where/when appropriate.  
Fertilizers, farm machinery and seafood are not included in the definition of agriculture and agri-food trade.  
Commodity categories are based on the internationally standardized Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS codes).  
Wherein a single commodity is 90 percent or more of an HS group, the specific commodity is named.
