
# Maryland exported \$86 million to Canada, including:

- → \$19M in spices (including \$13M in ground pepper)
- → \$19M in prepared nuts
- → \$8M in vegetables and legumes (including \$6M in lettuce)
- → \$8M in animal by-products (including \$7M in by-products for production of animal feed)
- → \$5M in food preparations

## Maryland imported \$231 million from Canada, including:

- → \$39M in vegetables and legumes (including \$8M in cucumbers)
- → \$35M in frozen fries
- → \$22M in breads and pastries
- → \$21M in sauces and condiments
- → \$16M in alcoholic beverages (including \$10M in whiskey)

### A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Maryland, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$86 million came from Maryland.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
