
# Maryland exported \$77 million to Canada, including:

- → \$12M in ground pepper
- → \$6M in beverages
- → \$5M in sauces and condiments
- → \$4M in lettuce
- → \$3M in animal by-products

# Maryland imported \$261 million from Canada, including:

- → \$37M in animal feed (including \$25M in canola meal)
- → \$30M in baked goods
- → \$24M in processed potatoes (including fries and chips)
- → \$21M in sauces and condiments
- → \$16M in alcoholic beverages (including \$11M in whiskies)
