AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$2.2 BILLION IN 2014
Let's keep a good thing growing!



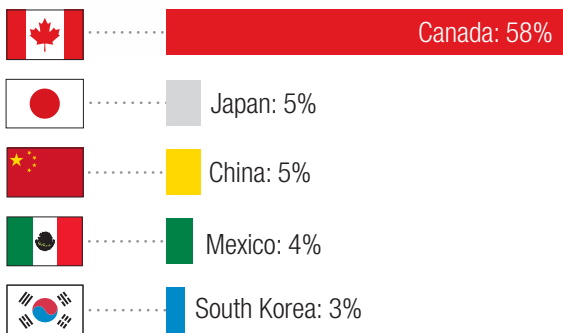
Michigan exported \$1.2 billion to Canada, including:

- \$134M in fresh/frozen beef
- \$124M in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- \$112M in corn
- \$93M in tomatoes
- \$93M in prepared cereal grains (including breakfast cereals)

Michigan imported \$1 billion from Canada, including:

- \$241M in vegetables (including \$87M in tomatoes)
- \$70M in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- \$67M in canola meal
- \$53M in baked goods
- \$53M in fresh/frozen pork

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Michigan has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2014, of which \$1.2B came from Michigan.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
