

# BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Minnesota is a major agricultural producer, accounting for over 4% of total U.S. exports and ranking as the seventh largest exporting state in the country. Minnesota's top two agricultural export commodities are soybeans and soybean products, and corn, accounting for approximately 30% and 27% of Minnesota's export market respectively. Minnesota exported \$108 million in soybean meal and \$28 million in corn, used for animal feed, to Canada. These products helped feed Canadian cattle, which were then exported to Minnesota. The integration of Minnesota-Canada supply chains enables product specialization, ensuring a successful trading relationship where both are supplied with high quality agricultural products.

#### TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN MINNESOTA

→ Approximately 157,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
