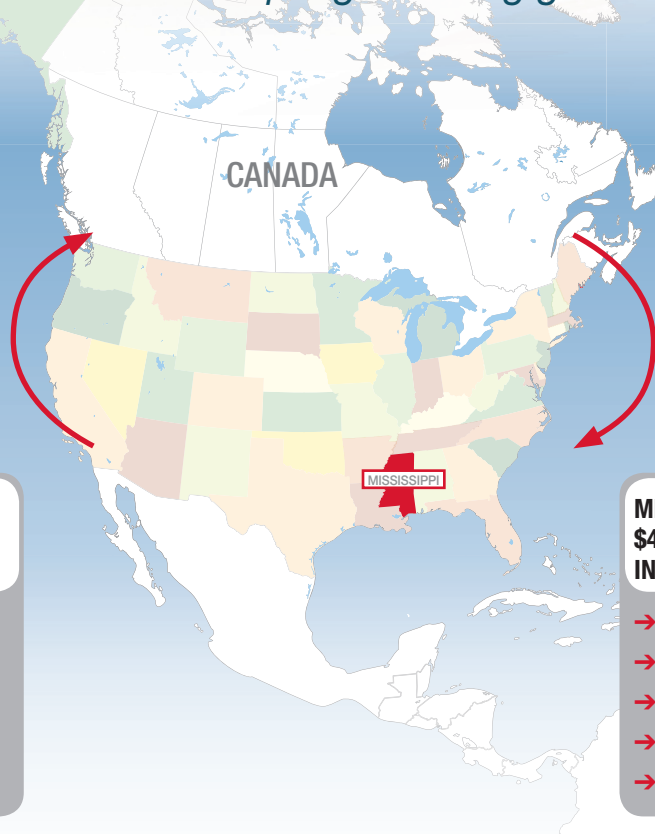

Let's keep a good thing growing!



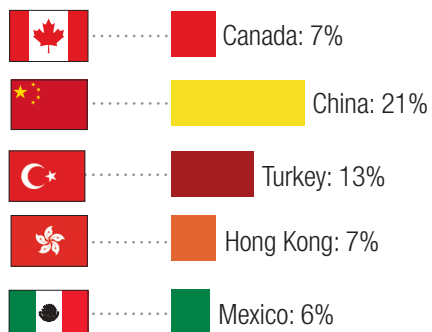
**MISSISSIPPI EXPORTED
\$81 MILLION TO CANADA,

- \$6M in sauces and condiments
- \$3M in prepared chicken

**MISSISSIPPI IMPORTED
\$49 MILLION FROM CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$33M in breakfast cereals
- \$3M in breads and pastries
- \$2M in frozen fries
- \$2M in whiskey
- \$0.4M in canola oil

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

The United States and Canada enjoy the largest bilateral trading relationship in the world. As each other's best customers for agriculture and agri-food products, both countries have seen an enormous expansion in cross-border activity over the past 20 years. When production rates fail to keep pace with domestic demand, each country has been able to supplement the production of the other. Furthermore, this mutually beneficial trading relationship makes both countries more competitive internationally, and provides both consumers and producers with a greater variety of goods and services.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN MISSISSIPPI

- Approximately 68,000 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
