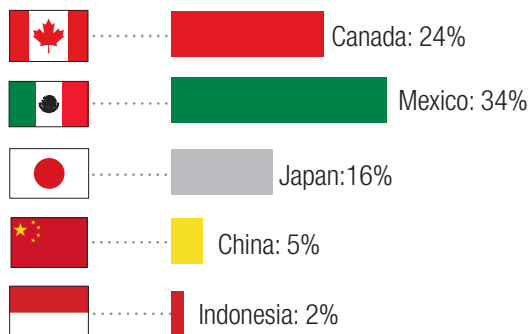

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

One of Missouri's primary exports to Canada is pork products, but this has not always been the case. In 2000 the state's pork exports to Canada totaled less than \$1 million, five years later this total reached \$7 million, and the \$37 million total in 2010 demonstrates that the upward trend continues at the turn of a new decade. As our bilateral trading relationship continues to grow it strengthens our exporting sectors, creates jobs, promotes specialization and efficiency in production processes, and provides our consumers with a greater variety of quality goods.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN MISSOURI

- Approximately 162,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
