
Missouri exported \$408 million to Canada, including:

- → \$126M in syrups and concentrates
- → \$45M in animal/pet feed (including \$32M in dog and cat food)
- → \$32M in chocolate products
- → \$30M in corn
- → \$27M in prepared cereal grains

Missouri imported \$226 million from Canada, including:

- → \$61M in wheat (including \$44M in durum wheat)
- → \$26M in pet feed
- → \$25M in fats and oils (including \$21M in canola oil)
- → \$18M in breads and pastries
- → \$14M in seeds (including \$4M in linseed)

Missouri's top agriculture and agri-food export markets:



A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Missouri, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$408 million came from Missouri.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
