
# Montana exported \$68 million to Canada, including:

- → \$25M in malt
- → \$8M in seeds (including \$7M in canola seeds)
- → \$6M in pasta
- → \$5M in live animals
- \$4M in wheat

# Montana imported \$137 million from Canada, including:

- → \$46M in canola meal
- → \$26M in wheat
- → \$13M in seeds (including \$3M in canola seeds)
- → \$10M in vegetables and legumes (including \$7M in peas)
- → \$9M in malt

### A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Montana, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$68 million came from Montana.
