AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$205 MILLION IN 2013

Let's keep a good thing growing!



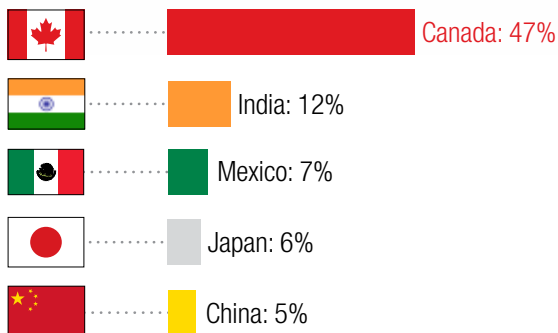
Montana exported \$68 million to Canada, including:

- \$25M in malt
- \$8M in seeds (including \$7M in canola seeds)
- \$6M in pasta
- \$5M in live animals
- \$4M in wheat

Montana imported \$137 million from Canada, including:

- \$46M in canola meal
- \$26M in wheat
- \$13M in seeds (including \$3M in canola seeds)
- \$10M in vegetables and legumes (including \$7M in peas)
- \$9M in malt

Montana's top agriculture and agri-food export markets:



A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Montana, has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$68 million came from Montana.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
