
NEBRASKA EXPORTED \$267 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

The integration of Nebraska-Canada supply chains is at the heart of our successful trading relationship in agriculture. For example, whereas Canada is the world's second largest exporter of cattle, Nebraska is among the world's 20 largest exporters of beef. In 2010, Nebraska imported \$95 million of Canadian cattle and exported \$95 million of beef to Canada. The bilateral trading relationship between Nebraska and Canada ensures that both can further develop their areas of specialization and can supply each other with high quality agricultural products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN NEBRASKA

→ Approximately 55,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
