Let's keep a good thing growing!




Nebraska exported \$431 million to Canada, including:

- → \$213M in fresh/frozen meat (including \$144M in beef)
- → \$43M in animal feed (including \$26M in dog and cat food)
- → \$31M in ethanol
- → \$27M in prepared cereal grains (including breakfast cereal)
- → \$15M in fruits and nuts

Nebraska imported \$520 million from Canada, including:

- → \$312M in live cattle
- → \$65M in fresh/frozen meat (including \$39M in beef)
- → \$62M in oats
- → \$22M in animal feed (including \$16M in canola meal)
- → \$10M in wheat

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Feeding an integrated supply chain! Canadian cattle production supports an efficient supply-chain relationship with Nebraska, and Nebraska's top ranked cattle and beef industry is valued by Canadians for its animal processing efficiencies. In 2014, Canada exported \$312M in cattle to Nebraska. In turn, in the same year, Nebraska exported \$144M in beef to Canada. High-quality cattle from Canada help Nebraska's feedlots and processing plants operate at full capacity, while Nebraska's meat industry expertise provides options for processing Canadian livestock. It is therefore critical that agricultural policies do not run counter to these market efficiencies. Working together, the beef trade between Nebraska and Canada can thrive, supporting jobs and economies in rural communities.
