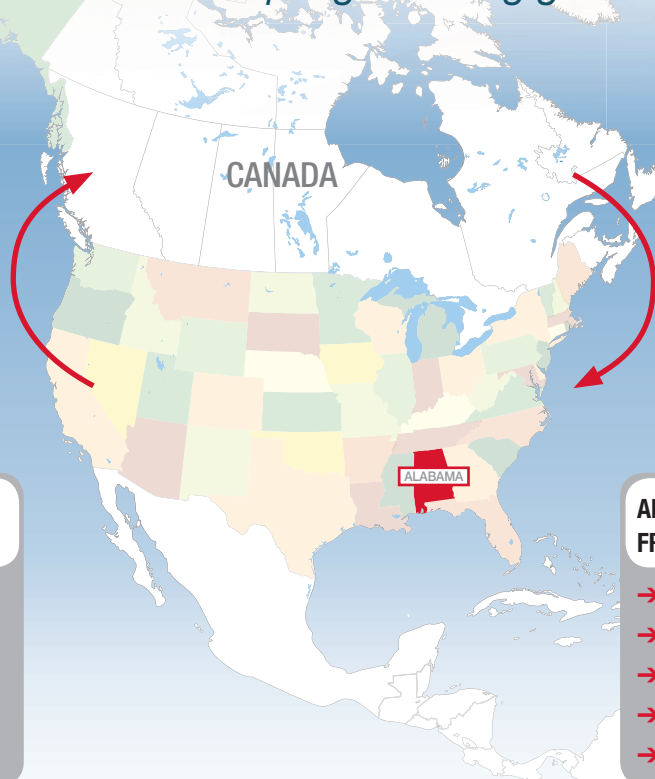


ALABAMA-CANADA

AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$105 MILLION IN 2010

Let's keep a good thing growing!



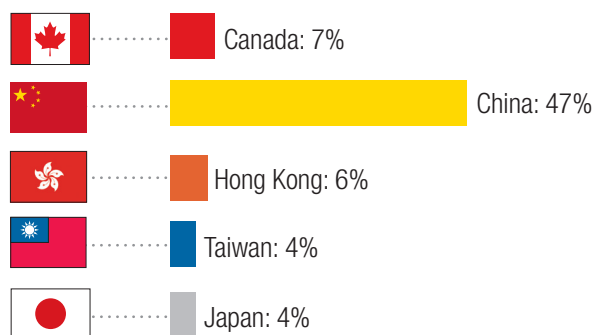
ALABAMA EXPORTED \$71 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$31M in chicken
- \$18M in animal feed
- \$7M in prepared chicken
- \$5M in eggs
- \$3M in domestic fowls

ALABAMA IMPORTED \$34 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$11M in non-durum wheat
- \$9M in breads and pastries
- \$2M in canola oil
- \$2M in food preparations
- \$1M in tomatoes

ALABAMA'S TOP AGRICULTURAL EXPORT MARKETS



BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Alabama exported \$13 million in dog and cat food, and \$5 million in animal feed to Canada. Meanwhile, Canada exported \$11 million in non-durum wheat, which supported the production of animal feeds in Alabama. The Alabama-Canada bilateral trading relationship allows sector specialization and integration that ensures Alabama has an export market for their feed, and that Canadian livestock and domestic pets are well fed.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN ALABAMA

- Approximately 115,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
