
## ALABAMA EXPORTED \$71 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

# ALABAMA IMPORTED \$34 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$11M in non-durum wheat
- → \$9M in breads and pastries
- → \$2M in canola oil
- → \$2M in food preparations
- → \$1M in tomatoes

# BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Alabama exported \$13 million in dog and cat food, and \$5 million in animal feed to Canada. Meanwhile, Canada exported \$11 million in non-durum wheat, which supported the production of animal feeds in Alabama. The Alabama-Canada bilateral trading relationship allows sector specialization and integration that ensures Alabama has an export market for their feed, and that Canadian livestock and domestic pets are well fed.

#### TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN ALABAMA

→ Approximately 115,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
