
Alabama exported \$98 million to canada, including:

- → \$36M in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- → \$24M in prepared meat (including \$17M in prepared chicken meat)
- → \$20M in animal/pet feed (including \$13M in dog and cat food)
- → \$6M in prepared nuts
- → \$2M in eggs

Alabama imported \$93 million from canada, including:

- → \$51M in fats and oils (including \$36M in canola oil)
- \$12M in breads and pastries
- → \$10M in non-durum wheat
- → \$5M in corn
- → \$4M in alcoholic beverages (including \$3M in whiskey)

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Arizona, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$98 million came from Alabama.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
