
NEW HAMPSHIRE EXPORTED \$19 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

NEW HAMPSHIRE IMPORTED \$81 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$20M in pork
- → \$16M in maple syrup and maple sugar
- → \$14M in animal feed
- → \$4M in yeast
- → \$2M in breads and pastries

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Bilateral trade has allowed residents of both New Hampshire and Canada to satisfy their sweet tooth. In 2010, Canada imported \$0.5 million worth of sugar candies and \$14 million worth of chocolate goods from New Hampshire. These two products combined to account for over 75% of New Hampshire's total agricultural exports to Canada. New Hampshire, on the other hand, looked to Canada to supply them with world famous Canadian Maple Syrup, of which it imported \$16 million worth in 2010. The bilateral trading relationship between New Hampshire and Canada ensures that both places can further develop their areas of specialization and can supply each other with high quality sweets.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

→ Approximately 38,000 jobs (or 1 in 20 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
