
New Hampshire exported \$22 million to Canada, including:

- → \$16M in chocolate products
- → \$2M in candy
- → \$0.9M in breads and pastries
- → \$0.6M in sauces and condiments
- → \$0.3M in food preparations

New Hampshire imported \$83 million from Canada, including:

- → \$24M in fresh/frozen pork
- → \$16M in maple syrup
- → \$10M in yeast
- → \$5M in live plants
- → \$4M in fresh/frozen beef

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular New Hampshire, has benefited from this strong relationship

 with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from
 the U.S. in 2013, of which \$22 million came from New Hampshire.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
