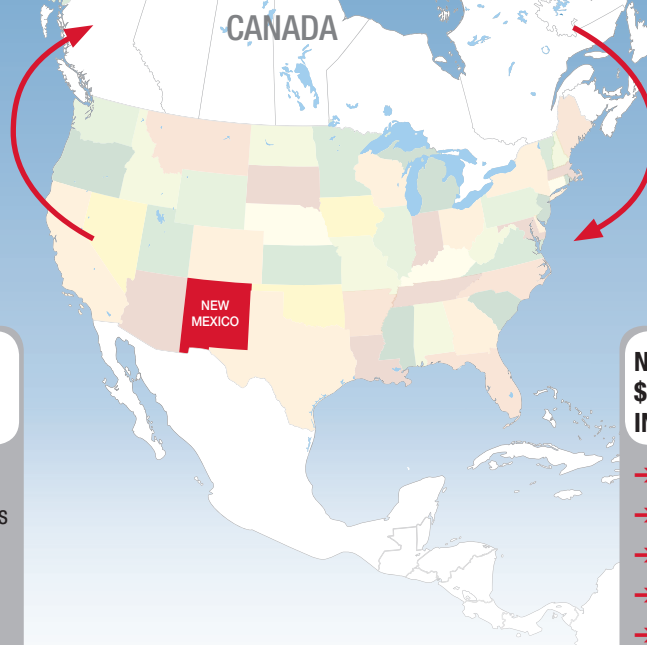


NEW MEXICO-CANADA

Let's keep a good thing growing!



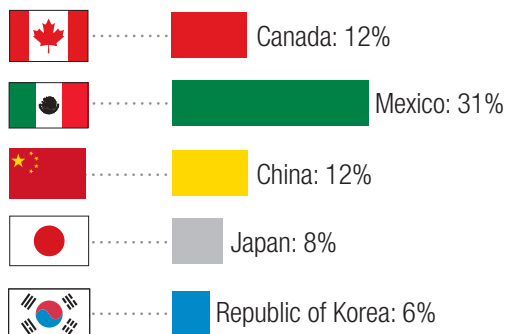
**NEW MEXICO EXPORTED
\$11 MILLION TO CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$4M in onions
- \$2M in semi-processed cereal grains
- \$1M in nuts
- \$0.9M in sauces and condiments
- \$0.6M in pepper

**NEW MEXICO IMPORTED
\$10 MILLION FROM CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$2M in canola meal
- \$2M in breads and pastries
- \$2M in whiskey
- \$0.8M in food preparations
- \$0.5M in oats

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

The United States and Canada enjoy the largest bilateral trading relationship in the world. As each other's best customers for agriculture and agri-food products, both countries have seen an enormous expansion in cross-border activity over the past 20 years. When production rates fail to keep pace with domestic demand, each country has been able to supplement the production of the other. Furthermore, this mutually beneficial trading relationship makes both countries more competitive internationally, and provides both consumers and producers with a greater variety of goods and services.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN NEW MEXICO

- Approximately 49,400 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
